From the Rector

Calendars are a fascinating study. We are beginning a new calendar year this month—Happy 2020! We began a new church year at the beginning of December and we are now half-way through our program year. At the end of this month we have our annual meeting and then our church budget year begins. Calendars are ways we use to mark off the time in our lives. We see in the Scriptures that calendars are gifts from God. He gave us ways to mark time through the seasons, through the movements of the moon and through the changing of the stars in the night sky. It is important for us to make marks in time so that we make time for celebrations, a time to reach a goal, and time to remember God. If we did not have calendars, all days would be the same and that is not what God wants. That's why he had the ancient Hebrews have one day a week as a holy day. Every week they were to set that one day aside; they were to treat it differently than all the other days of the week. On that day they were to spend time with God; they were to spend time resting; they were to spend time with each other. Then throughout the year God had his people set other days aside for special purposes. We do the same thing still, don't we? It is still important for us to set time aside to worship God, and to celebrate and to make our goals.

Speaking of making time for celebrations every year at St. Andrew's we stop on the first Sunday after Epiphany, January 5, and celebrate our church's birthday. Betty Audette used to tell me that the first Sunday after Epiphany is not really our church's birthday; our real birthday is on June 29th when we were officially formed by Bishop Hargrave in 1971. However, if we were to wait to celebrate until June 29th much of our congregation would not be here. So

we want to celebrate when all of us are here. This year for our birthday as always we have much to celebrate! On this day we celebrate and thank our many, many volunteers, we announce our Volunteer of the Year, and celebrate our clergy anniversaries.

Another purpose of calendars is to help us make goals. Our Vestry makes goals every year at the annual vestry retreat. Our retreat takes place the first weekend of February and we spend time Friday evening and Saturday together talking and making goals for the year. Over the years we have planned for physical needs of our church, the projectors and screens; the narthex, the pews, the renovation of the sacristy, and most recently the flooring of Krysher Hall. We plan for spiritual needs as well by considering what we can do as a church to encourage people to come to know the Lord Jesus and learn to follow him better.

A new year always starts with such promise. And even though one would think in 2020 we would have perfect vision, (I really had to put in at least one pun for this year) we do not know what will really happen. We have hopes, expectations, and perhaps fears. Yet what will be has yet to be discovered and experienced. Scripture tells us that God's mercies are new every morning! We know God can be trusted because He is faithful.

This coming year may you desire to experience God's presence more in your life and may your desire to serve God grow. And pray for St. Andrew's

that we will grow so that we can continue to help our church community, our Spring Hill community, and even those throughout the world.

About Our Vestry:

Who are the vestry and what do they do? Similar to our Liturgical Moments I thought perhaps this would be helpful as we approach another vestry election. The vestry is a group of 9 people from our church membership who typically serve for 3 years. They are the legal representatives and agents of our St. Andrew's parish and share leadership responsibilities with the rector. These people make decisions concerning the budget and then approve the church budget before it goes to the annual meeting to be approved by the congregation. They help me make decisions about church direction and priorities. They also let me know problems that they see in the church and recommend how these problems can be solved.

The people that I look for to serve on the vestry are as follows: I first look for people who love our Lord Jesus and want His church here at St. Andrew's to grow. Secondly I want people who are involved in trying to grow spiritually through regular church attendance and through attending Adult Bible study, Adult Formation, or another study like the Men's group or Belle's studies. And then I want people who are already involved in church ministries. We do not need people who are side-line coaches. We need people who are involved and already serving in the church in some way. And finally I look for people who have a heart for others, who are concerned about those around them in church. Did you know that our vestry members pray weekly, some of them daily, for people in our church? It is true. Your current vestry members are wonderful leaders! This coming annual meeting I hope you will vote more people like them to serve on this coming year's vestry.

This year the following vestry positions are up for election: Craig Gates, Maureen Follansbee, and Dale Hatch all 3 year positions and then Carolyn Wallner and Jackie Ruth (temporarily filled by Nancy Cotter) which are one year positions. So there are five positions that will be voted upon. There are currently 6 candidates. The ones with the 3 highest number of votes will take the 3 year positions. The two with the next highest number of votes will take the one year positions and the one with the least amount of votes will be the vestry alternate.

By-laws Revision

This coming January in our Annual Meeting the vestry is proposing a revision to our church By-laws. As per the by-laws this has to be announced at least 3 weeks before the meeting. The proposed revision is as follows: Change the name of Article 6 from Endowment Fund to Investment Reserve Fund. Further change the article to read "Responsibility for investment reserve funds resides within the Vestry. Funds can be managed through an investment company, endowment management company, diocesan investment trust, Episcopal Church Foundation or a St. Andrew's Committee." The current wording is as follows: "Responsibility for endowment funds and quasi endowment funds resides within the Vestry. Funds can be managed through an investment company, endowment management company, diocesan investment trust, Episcopal Church Foundation or a St. Andrew's Committee."

The reason for this revision is the Diocese has requested our by-laws to be changed. The reason they gave us is as follows: 'The issue here is terminology. An endowment is a very specific item with restrictions for usage. It seems this account is not an endowment and the vestry does not want it treated as an endowment. Therefore, the name of the account should be changed. As it is now, the name is misleading to those wishing to contribute to it." The diocese recommended that we change the name to Investment Reserve Fund to reflect how it is currently be treated by the vestry.

The account being discussed is the church's SSGA investment account. The vestry some five years ago designated that the church should keep at least 100,000 as a minimum. Monies over that amount may, at the vestry's discretion, be used for ministry, outreach, or other uses as it so designates. Currently the balance in this account is at \$109,000.




