St. Andrew's Spring Hill calls The Reverend **Matthew Theodore** Grunfeld as it's next rector

It is with great pleasure that

the Vestry of St. Andrew's, Spring Hill has unanimously called the Rev. Matthew T. Grunfeld as it's next rector. Fr. Matthew will relocate from Holmes Beach, FL where he has been rector of The Church of the Annunciation since 2015. He is also the dean of the Manasota Deanery and is involved in the Diocese of Southwest Florida as a member of the Diocesan council, instructor in the school of music and Cursillo.

We will welcome Fr. Matthew on Saturday August 31st, for his first weekend celebrating the Eucharist as our new rector.

Please see Fr. Matthew's letter to the congregation below:

Dear People of St. Andrew's,

I bring you greetings in the name of Jesus Christ. I am humbled and honored to accept the call of your Vestry to be your priest and rector. I have met wonderful people at St. Andrew's during the call process, and I look forward to meeting all of you soon. I look forward to walking in the footsteps of those who have labored with God to bring St. Andrew's thus far in its witness and ministry to Spring Hill and to venture into the future as Hernando County continues to grow and change.

I will begin my tenure on the weekend of August 31 and September 1, where I will preach and preside at the Eucharist. Because I am moving from Anna Maria Island in Manatee County, it is possible you might see me make an appearance around the church campus before then as I move some of my personal effects out of my current parish.

My theology and ministry is grounded in the Benedictine pattern of prayer, life in community, and conversion of life. I believe we meet God at the Altar during the Holy Eucharist, but also at the other tables we experience in our lives.

My father is Jewish, and my mother is an Episcopalian. They decided to have me baptized at St. Thomas Episcopal Church in my hometown of Columbus, Georgia. I also attended Roman Catholic schools for most of my younger years and hold a bachelor's degree in Political Science and Sociology from Emory University in Atlanta, a venerable United Methodist institution. Ultimately, I decided to stay with the church of my family and childhood.

It was as a college undergraduate that I discerned a call to the priesthood and was sponsored for ordination by St. Thomas and the Diocese of Atlanta. After serving in a clinical chaplain residency at a hospital in my hometown for a year after graduating college, I moved to New York City to attend the General Theological Seminary of the Episcopal Church. It was as a student at GTS that I came to love the rich Anglican liturgical tradition. It is also where I gained an appreciation for life and culture outside of my roots in the Deep South. I was ordained to the diaconate as a seminarian in 2006 and to the priesthood in 2008. I have served parishes in the Dioceses of Atlanta, New York, Alabama, and, since 2015, the Church of the

Annunciation on Anna Maria Island. I am glad to be continuing my ministry in the Diocese of Southwest Florida under the leadership of your native son, Bishop Scharf.

When I am not busy with church matters, I enjoy traveling, hiking, kayaking, and giving treats to my dog, Bruno. I also eagerly await my Atlanta Braves recapturing first place in the National League East after the All Star Break, as is tradition.

You all at St. Andrew's are in my prayers, and I look forward to being with you soon.

Someone was mentioning to me that people don't realize

the cost of many of the things associated with the day to day operation of the A couple of years ago I church. thought if you, who tithe and donate money, knew where your money was being used, it might be more gratifying than just part of a "general fund"; although the "general fund" does pay the bills. I'm a very budget-minded person and I like to see what I'm getting for my money. Although this is not stewardship time, I believe we need to be good stewards of our money all year and I also believe it is important to know how that money is used. The Altar Guild alone requires about \$350-\$500 per month just to maintain communion supplies, candle oil and flowers. The cost to dry clean one Chasuble and matching stoles is currently The Fair Linen (the white cloth that covers the Altar) is also sent to the cleaners on an as needed basis. Spills and wine spots are not acceptable on the Lord's Table. The other linens used in the Eucharist are cared for by a member of the Altar Guild who donates all laundering supplies and time needed to keep the lines free of stains and available for all service needs. This does not cover the occasional need to replace these items used in the Eucharist services. Additional services such as holidays or funerals require the candles to be filled more often and as attendance increases, the use of communion hosts and wine also increases. Our visiting Eucharistic ministers take communion to the homebound and to our parishioners in the hospital. Do you ever wonder who orders the hosts or how we always have enough wine to serve? If you could say "here's a check for a case of wine, the dry cleaning, the devotional candles, candle oil or a case of host wafers", wouldn't it be rewarding knowing exactly what your contribution was used for? Sometimes we need to see something tangible to attach to our tithes and donations to feel that our contributions are treasured and appreciated, which they are. It isn't necessary to seek out someone to "earmark" your gift but remember, as the cost of maintaining your home, your utilities and insurances increase, so do these expenses increase for our church. Please be aware of the expenses to keep our campus beautiful, our buildings maintained, our ministries supported and our church operational, comfortable and secure. Offer your tithes and gifts with joy in your heart in support of our many ministries and our church. Your time is one of the most important resources for our ministries. Please pray about which ministry you can make time for. God gives us every day and we need to give time back in service to

Additional information regarding the Treasurer's Report:

The amount of income for the months of May and June is substantially lower than previous months. This is why: Last year the church received an investment account from a parishioner who passed. When the investment account was added as an asset, it was also included as income. The fact that it was included as income as well as an investment was overlooked. When the church decided to close the account in December 2023, we knew that we would receive the funds from that investment in January and so included it as income in the 2024 budget. This was done in error. Since the funds were included as income in 2023, it could not be included in the 2024 budget as income. This error was addressed in May 2024; therefore, income in the 2024 budget is \$29,437.98 less than anticipated. Rest assured that the money received from the investment account is in the bank; it just cannot be used as income with regard to the 2024 budget. Due to this error, the church most likely will be over budget at the end of 2024. As Treasurer, I sincerely apologize for this error.
