Happy New Year and welcome to 2024! May we all be blessed with God's presence in our lives. By the time you read this, our Office of Transition Ministry (OTM) paperwork will be in the Office of the Diocese for editing and final approval. Our diocesan-required Holy Cow Survey has been completed and the results were presented to the Vestry and Survey Committee on December 16, 2023. The very detailed parish profile is progressing well and we hope to submit it to the Diocese for approval in mid-January. All the above information and results will be available on our church website when completed and we start to advertise for a new rector.

Starting in January, we will use supply priests for our weekend services. The Rev. Joseph Diaz will preside the first 3 weeks of the month and Fr. Fred will preside the last week in the month. February and March will be officiated by Rev. Kathryn Jeffrey. Supply priests are in short supply and difficult to find. We are blessed to have all our services covered by such experienced priests. Finding an Interim priest or full time rector will be our next challenge.

Our appreciation goes out to all who have made contributions to the search process. Volunteers are continuing to contribute many, many hours as St. Andrew's continues to do the work God has given us to do.

May this be a time of creativity, spiritual abundance and innovative growth with a renewed commitment to our community of faith and our mission.

St. Andrews parishioners and staff are friendly, attentive and they give you a sense of belonging. In addition there are opportunities to get involve in different ministries and stay close to God.

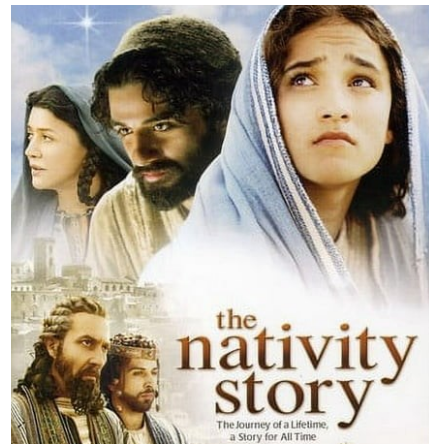
Are you able to be present for Vestry meetings on the third Sunday of the month at 12:15 p.m.? (this is our current schedule)

WHY DO YOU WANT TO SERVE AS A VESTRY MEMBER OF ST. ANDREWS?

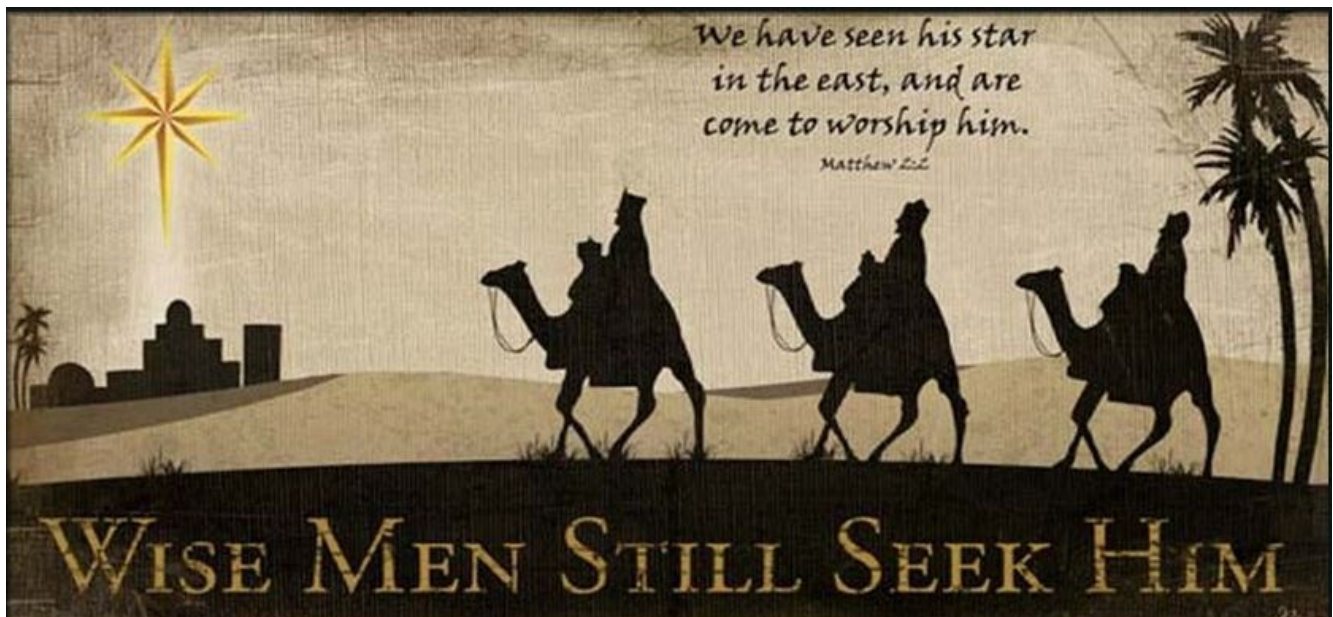

Why do you want to serve as a Vestry member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church?

At this time one year ago, Fr. Lance expressed his desire for me to run for Vestry. I sincerely appreciated his confidence and that of all who voted for me!

Having been a Vestry member for 2023, I have learned much about the workings of St. Andrew's, and have had the joyful duty of getting better acquainted with several more members of our congregations and praying for their individual needs.

St. Andrew's is now challenged with finding a successor for Fr. Lance. As members are already chosen for the search and transition teams, I am eager to have a voice in the process from the Vestry.

While we all must fairly avoid making personal comparisons, we as a congregation should pray to be blessed with a new rector who, though unique, will be equally qualified, knowledgeable, and devoted to Christ and this mission.

What are your qualifications for this position?

My career was in industrial electrical construction and maintenance. During those thirty years I was often responsible to plan, lay out work, estimate, and order materials. I did most installations myself and on a few large projects served as a foreman directing a crew of ten. On some jobs I participated in lunchtime Bible studies. I was also on an employee council for a several years which was a line of communication between management and the work force. For twelve years, I had second part-time employment in a large Christian bookstore/resource center.

Tell us a little about yourself and your faith.

I was born in Syracuse, NY and raised in Protestant churches where my steadfast parents were very active. I grew up on the traditional hymns as my mother was an organist all her adult life. I always appreciated a good sermon illustrating God's love for me and how I should live, but I didn't grasp that God required me to repent and make a decision to accept Jesus' redemptive

claim on my life. Swayed by popular "scientific" education, I just kept doing my good turns daily as an Eagle Scout, assuming that if God was real, they would offset my faults.

Kath and I married in 1970 at St. Andrew's Episcopal Church (in Syracuse, NY), as that was her firm conviction and I had no denominational preference. When I was thirty and had unusual pressures mounting in my life, my brother-in-law faithfully presented the clear Gospel message to me in a way that clicked. I accepted Jesus Christ as my personal Savior and have carried the hope of His promises ever since.

I am a dedicated husband of fifty-three years, have three children who all graduated from a Christian school and Christian colleges, and have six grandchildren.

Following my electrical career I was a live-in caregiver for ten years, serving one elderly gentleman for six years and another for four years until their respective deaths. In 2012 Kath and I moved to Spring Hill and provided private elder-care for a couple years before retiring. We started attending St. Andrew's soon after and love our church home.

What do you love about our church?

St. Andrew's is a body of believers who love, serve, encourage, challenge, pray, and teach each other to grow in the Lord in a variety of caring ways, led by wonderfully dedicated clergy and with competent staff. I love the ways that we are connected to Christ and to each other.

We have been blessed by Fr. Lance's shepherding. 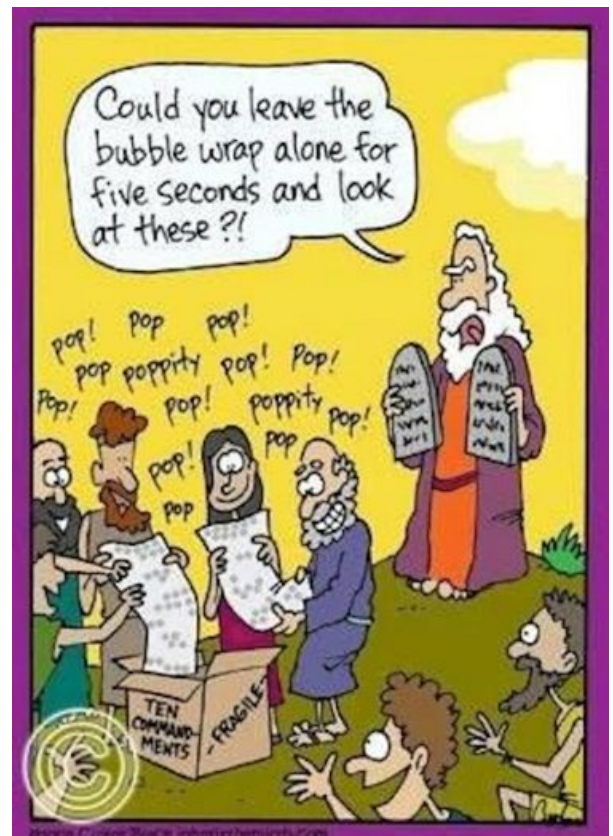
