God has a purpose for each of us just as God had a purpose for the young servant girl we read about in 2 Kings 5. She served the wife of Naaman, army commander for the king of Aram. Her faith changed the course of Naaman's life and helped alter his hostile view of Israel.

Many of us cannot fathom how God could use us, even in this time of church transition when our cohesiveness is so important. But God is continually working in and through our lives. We do not have to be great theologians to be used mightily by God. We just need to trust that we have been called to follow God, whatever our circumstances. We can trust that God has a purpose for our lives. Remember we are His disciples and this is how Christina Makeyeva reminds us.....


