Dear People of St. Andrew's,

After being approved as a Postulant for Holy Orders back in 2003, I spent a year working as a lay student chaplain in a hospital in my hometown before moving to New York to attend seminary.



About a month before I began, a new federal rule went into effect regarding the privacy of healthcare information of patients in the hospital. This rule is part of HIPPA law and is one of the boilerplate forms you are asked to sign with healthcare providers. It led to significant changes to how the Pastoral Services office at the hospital operated. We were adjusting to this new reality as I began my position in the hospital.

Once upon a time, hospitals recorded church affiliations when patients were admitted to hospitals. It was common for Pastoral Services staff to contact clergy to let them know their members had been admitted. This was generally done regardless of whether a patient requested contact be made. For the past 21 years, hospitals have no longer been able to call church congregations unless a patient makes a specific request of the chaplain's office. In many cases, budget cuts have led hospitals to reduce their chaplain staffing to the minimal levels required by Joint Commission accreditation guidelines. There is often no one to make the call.

While this rule has been in effect for over two decades, its rules can still come as a surprise to those who are unfamiliar with how hospitals now operate. We continue to hear stories of those who are disappointed not to receive a call from their clergy or other church representatives when they are hospitalized. The reason this happens is that church staffs are unaware of the situation.

While I sometimes hear things through the grapevine,

the only guaranteed way for me to know that you are in the hospital is for you or a loved one to take the initiative to call the church. I want to know when you are admitted so that I can offer the ministrations of the church when you are admitted. If I am unavailable, a representative of the St. Andrew's Pastoral Care Team may visit on behalf of the church. The only certain way for this to happen is if we receive a call at the church.

If you are anticipating a scheduled surgery, please let me know in advance when you are planning to have the procedure. If you have an emergency admission, please give me a call as soon as possible. If you are not up for making a call, please ask a loved one to make the call. If you rely on the support of a family member who is unchurched, I encourage you to have a conversation with them while you are in good health as they may not think to make a call on your behalf.

A parishioner in my last parish once said, "Father Matthew's magic 8 ball is broken!" She was quite correct! I take my responsibility to make calls in the hospital seriously, but I can only do it if I know.

It is the vestry's obligation to prioritize these goals and address them systematically.

Father Matthew has begun addressing the issue of serving our families with children. Through e-Chimes, he has put out a call to volunteers who feel called to work on a team to provide religious instruction for the youngsters who attend our services. Religious education is another vital ministry with many rewards. Please do not hesitate to contact Fr. Matthew with any questions.

Your vestry is determined to work on the challenges highlighted acknowledging they will take time and diligent effort. We pray that our membership will eagerly offer their talents and time to help our church continue to thrive. It is a blessing to serve Christ and follow His teachings.














Flowering of the Cross




