### FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

So what are your New Year's resolutions for 2014? During this time of year many people resolve to lose weight, exercise, drink less alcohol, eat better food, get a better education, get a better job, manage their debt, save money, or whatever and so on! These are all good things to resolve to do aren't they?

I would like to recommend a couple for you to consider as well. The first is to spend more time reading the Bible, perhaps to resolve to read the entire book this year. Whether or not you do resolve to read through the Bible, perhaps you would enjoy a class I plan to teach called *A Tourist's Trip Through the Bible* this spring. I hope you will attend.

The second recommendation for a resolution is that you choose to pray for someone or something specifically. Choose someone or something that God has made you concerned about and resolve to pray for a person or about a situation several times a day every day this year. At this time next year I think you will be amazed at what has happened.

This time of the year it is not only appropriate to consider what to change about ourselves for this coming year but it is appropriate to reflect on what has happened. For some it has been a pretty tough year. Loved ones may have died. Sicknesses or injuries may have been endured or suffered. Other events may have happened which have made life harder. Life has changed from what it was last year at this time. For others life may not be much different than last year and for the rest, there was a change, but it was good.

For all of us no matter what group we fit

into, as we consider our lives we as Christians need also to consider our relationship with God. Is our relationship to God closer or are we feeling less close? How do you know or gauge your relationship with God, anyway? We gauge our relationship with God pretty much the same way we do with each other. If we avoid a person and do not like talking to him or her that is a good indication that your relationship is not doing well. On the other hand if you want to spend more time with and want to talk to a person that is a good indication that the relationship is going well. It is the same with our relationship with God. Do you talk with God frequently throughout the day or do you go through your day and God doesn't even cross your mind? Clearly as Christians if we are not talking with God throughout our days then there is something wrong. So my final recommendation for a New Year's resolution is for you to work on improving your relationship with God. Learn more about Him from His Word, talk to Him regularly and learn to think about him and be with Him throughout your day.

May God richly bless you this coming year!


