



FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

I love this time of the year! The weather is warm but not too hot yet. The plants and flowers are blooming their little hearts out—which is good news for all but the lawn guys. May is one of those pivotal months of the year. It is this month temperature-wise that separates spring time from summer time. It is in this month that school kids are counting down weeks and then days until school is out. It is in this month we celebrate Pentecost and move into ordinary time. It is this month our addition is completed!

It is a pivotal time. As you may remember we began talking about building this addition in the spring of 2014. I felt that we needed to make our church more young family friendly. I would see moms or dads take their little ones out of the service when the children grew restless or started crying. Then the mother or father would walk up and down the bridge and then walk out towards the front in the effort to calm the little one down. Typically the family would not return after this happened. There were many families that came and left. So I saw a need to have a place where the parent could take the child and the child could make whatever noise he/she needed to make and in that place the mom and dad could still see and hear the service. We also needed to renovate our bathrooms. Because they were not air conditioned it was practically impossible to keep them smelling and feeling nice. Tom kept them clean, but because they were not under air, they always smelled like campground or gas station bathrooms. People who visited our church and needed to use our bathrooms were not favorably impressed by them and that affected their view of the church. And certainly our own

parishioners (especially the women) were not fond of these bathrooms. They were functional but certainly not attractive.

So now our addition will be ready within the next week or so. We will have a place for parents or grandparents to take their fussy babies. We will have nice bathrooms. We will have a room for toddlers. We will have a multi-purpose room which can be used for meetings and classes, for brides or for a family during a funeral. Will having this addition mean that our church will automatically grow dramatically, kind of like, 'build it and they will come?' No. Unfortunately that is not the case. All our wonderful addition will do is help meet a need. Through it people will be able to be more comfortable with their children. Through it we will have nice restrooms for our guests and for us. But to bring people in and to have them stay requires that we continue to invite them and when they attend continue to be friendly to them. Buildings no matter how nice will not take the place of people being welcoming and kind. However functional buildings can certainly remove reasons not to attend church.

So one part is done which is great news. The rest still depends upon us to welcome our visitors and encourage those attend to become part of our church body.

We are growing! Let us continue to grow and pray that God will use us to further His kingdom here in this church and in this community and even around the world!

WEEKEND BLESSINGS

In John's Gospel for the 3rd Sunday after Easter, Jesus tells Simon "To feed His sheep." The *Weekend Blessings* program (also known as the Backpack Ministry) attempts to do this by providing food for needy children to eat over the weekend. For the past

six years, a group of very dedicated members of St. Andrew's have gathered each Thursday that school is in session to place food in the backpacks of needy children (as determined by the school).

Food is provided through gift cards from People Helping People and redeemed at Winn Dixie. The set menu includes an entrée, a meat, breakfast food, juice or milk, fruit, and a snack. There is a three-week rotation of items in each category.

The backpacks are picked up at our school (Spring Hill Elementary) each Wednesday, filled on Thursday, returned to the school on Thursday, and sent home on Friday.

This program does not impact the budget of St. Andrew's. It should be noted that through the very generous and caring donation of our Youth Group each year we are able to supplement the menu several times a year with items not provided by People Helping People, like peanut butter, jelly, crackers, cereal, shelf milk and other snacks.

If you wish to contribute to this very important ministry, you may do so by making a contribution to St. Andrew's and on the memo" liner indicate "Backpack program."

This school year is almost concluded, but remembering Jesus' words Jesus to "feed His sheep," you might consider becoming involved in this very important ministry next year. Call Carolyn Wallner at 518-316-1318 or e-mail her at Thewallners@hotmail.com.

We can use people to assist in packing, picking up backpacks, delivering to the school, or picking up food. This ministry takes less than an hour a week.

P.S. For the School year 2015–2016 we provided food for 60–65 children each week. The need is great but the laborers are few!

The C.A.P.

Possibly the largest ministry at St. Andrew's is the C.A.P. It consists of approximately 30 members who believe in the power of prayer and have a deep love for our Lord. It has been in operation for the past seven years.

C.A.P. stands for *Computer Assisted Prayer*. To be a member you need: (a) a love of the Lord, (b) the belief that God hears and answers prayers, (c) time to pray and, (d) a computer.

This is an "on call" ministry that functions when a need is presented. For example: there is a need for a prayer such as (a friend is in the hospital, you just found out that you have a tumor, you or a friend are going to have surgery, etc.). A prayer request is sent to Carolyn Wallner at Thewallners@hotmail.com. After a time of reflection and prayer, a prayer is written and sent as with a prayer request to the C.A.P. members. All members are connected by computer, so the request is understood and prayers are offered as requested.

This ministry DOES NOT in any way take away from the prayers offered at our worship services, rather it supplements the need for prayers by requesting them immediately, before the weekend services.


The COOK TEAM
