# From the Rector

Dear Friends,

We have once again had a wonderful month here at St. Andrew's. We had a super Shrove Tuesday pancake dinner—thank you young people and youth leaders for cooking and cleaning for that once again! The next day we had meaningful Ash Wednesday services.

And now, once again we are in the season of Lent. We fast, we stop drinking wine or eating chocolate or something we really enjoy and for what reason? Why do we partake in such uncomfortable behavior? How can people say to each other, "Have a blessed Lent" when we act like this?

Lent is based upon the forty days of fasting that Jesus himself did right after he was baptized. You recall that as soon as he was baptized he went off into the wilderness to be tested by the Evil One. One of the reasons he did this was to prepare for his public ministry. As soon as he finished this time in the wilderness he started his public preaching, teaching, and healing ministry. What does that have to do with us at Lent you may ask? Like him, we are preparing ourselves. Ever since the fourth and fifth century the early church made time to prepare for Easter. As the years rolled by it gradually came to be the forty days we now have. But we like them still use this time to prepare ourselves for Easter. We prepare ourselves for the celebration of our Lord's mighty resurrection and victory over Death. If Ash Wednesday is the day we acknowledge our mortality; Easter is the day we celebrate our immortality! And we are both aren't we? We are both mortal and immortal. We are both physical and spiritual. Our bodies are physical and mortal; our souls, since we have been reborn through Jesus, are immortal and spiritual. Throughout Lent, we work on preparing ourselves for our spiritual, immortal lives. We try to lay aside and

exercise self-control over those parts of our lives having to do with our bodies and mortality. We are going to leave our mortality and all that pertains to it behind! God is going to give us new spiritual bodies, ones that don't wear out or develop problems like the ones we now have. The flip side of our preparation is to work on strengthening our spiritual lives; these are the parts of us that will be living forever.

So practically speaking how do we prepare for Easter; how do we prepare for our coming immortality? We are preparing in two ways aren't we? One is to exercise self-discipline like fasting from chocolate or wine or something nice that we like to do. We do this to develop control over our physical bodies. The other preparation is spiritual. We are trying to refocus our hearts on our heavenly home. We do this by making time to meditate, pray, and read God's word. People are encouraged to pick up new spiritual disciplines. We also have Lenten devotionals for you in the narthex to help.

So how can we say, "Have a blessed Lent?" We mean that during this time of Lent, may you develop a greater awareness of our coming immortality and see afresh the glory of Christ's mighty resurrection and victory over Death. With that in mind, have a blessed Lent my dear friends!

# The Deacon's Bench

Deacon Ludwig Wallner EASTER



On April 1, 2018 we will be celebrating Easter. Easter is the day that the church celebrates the feast of Christ's resurrection from the dead. Of all the feast days celebrated during the year, Easter is the oldest and greatest feast in the church year.

Easter Sunday marks the end of Holy Week which recalls for each of us the last week of Jesus' earthly ministry and death. It also marks the beginning of the church's Easter season which lasts for 50 days and ends with the Feast of Pentecost.

Christmas always falls on December 25, St. Valentine's Day always falls on February 14 and the Feast of the Epiphany always falls on January 6, why doesn't Easter fall on the same date each year? This year it falls on Sunday, April 1, next year on Sunday, April 21, in 2070 it will fall on Sunday, March 30, and in 2084 Easter will be on Sunday, March 26.

The key to the question is that in the year 325, the Church Council decided that Easter would always fall on Sunday. Other church feast days follow the calendar so the date remains the same but Easter follows the lunar calendar so the date for Easter moves.

On page 880 of our Book of Common Prayer are the rules for finding the date of Easter Sundays. "Easter Day is always the Sunday after the full moon that occurs on or after the spring equinox on March 21, a date which does not always correspond with an ancient ecclesiastical computation, and which does not always correspond to the astronomical equinox. This full moon may happen on any date between March 21 and April 18. Easter cannot be earlier than March 22 or later than April 25." There are also two points of reference needed to complete the calculations to find future Easter Sundays. These are "The Golden Number and the Sunday Letter" both of which are explained on page 880.

For your benefit, pages 882 and 883 of the Book of Common Prayer contain a table of Easter dates through 2089. So Easter is never early or late, it occurs when it is supposed to each year, but always on a Sunday.






