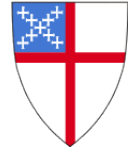

From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Although Easter Sunday is now behind us, we are still in the season of Easter and will be for the month of May. Every time we have Holy Communion in this season I say or chant the proper preface for Easter. This comes at the beginning of Holy Communion right after you say, "It is right to give him thanks and praise." I say a few more words and then the following: "But chiefly are we bound to praise you for the glorious resurrection of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; for he is the true Paschal Lamb, who was sacrificed for us, and has taken away the sin of the world. By his death he has destroyed death, and by his rising to life again he has won for us everlasting life."

This is a remarkable prayer. We say here that of all the things for which we praise God, and of course, there are very many, the chief thing is for the glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ. Typically we thank God for our daily food. We thank God for health and his help throughout our days. We thank and praise God for our family and friends. We thank and praise God for our homes, our jobs, and our community. But do we really thank God for the resurrection of Jesus Christ? I mean outside of church? If in fact, it is the chief thing for which we praise God we really ought to be thanking him and praising Him for it even outside of church.

I think one reason we typically do not praise and thank God for the resurrection is that we simply take it for granted. It is a historical fact. It is something with which we had nothing to do, and it seems that it has nothing to do with us

now. And I suppose in a sense that is right. We had nothing to do with the resurrection any more than we had anything to do with our own physical birth. But in the same way we ought not to take our own lives for granted but we ought to be thankful for our creation; in that same way we need to remember what God did for us in and through the resurrection of Jesus Christ and be thankful.

It is through the resurrection that we have peace with God—we have been reconciled with God; our sins are no longer between God and us. (Jesus is the true Paschal Lamb who died for our sins.) We also have been made into new people, a new creation through Jesus Christ and his resurrection. We have this new life which is an eternal life again through his resurrection. Do you see where this leads? Everything about our Christian life is dependent upon the resurrection of Jesus Christ. THAT is why we are chiefly bound, obligated, to praise God for the resurrection.

This is one of the main reasons that during this season we say, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! Because it is this season we especially remember and thank God for glorious resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The Deacon's Bench

Deacon Ludwig Wallner
CANDLES



How many of us have ever thought about the candles used in the Episcopal Church? On Saturday or Sunday, we watch the LEM, or Deacon or Verger light the candles and then at the end of the service they are extinguished. We use candles for a wide variety of symbolic and functional purposes, candles enrich our ceremonial life.

At St. Andrew's the Gospel candle is on the congregation's left and the Epistle candle is on their right. Tradition is that 'the Gospel candle never burns alone.' This is in reference to the fact that the gospel never stands by itself, it is always backed up by the witness of the apostles (the epistles), by the witness of the church, and by the witness of nature itself. So in deference to that fact, the Epistle candle is always lit first and then the Gospel candle is lit. And at the end of the service the Gospel candle is extinguished first and then the Epistle candle is extinguished.

The Paschal candle, is a special candle frequently decorated with a cross and/or other symbols. This candle is the first candle, to be lit from the new fire at the Easter Vigil. It represents the resurrection of Jesus and is lit first at every service in Easter season. Candles may be carried by the congregation at the Easter Vigil in joyful expectation of the celebration of Christ's resurrection and symbolically showing the light of Christ in our hearts.

Candles may also be carried in procession or held near the Gospel when its read; at this point they are referred to as processional torches. These torches symbolize the light of the gospel and how the gospel shows us the life and teachings of Jesus who is indeed the light of the world.

If a Baptism is performed during the Easter season, a candle is lit from the Paschal Candle and given to the family as a reminder of the date. At any other time during the year, the Baptismal Candle may be lit from the Gospel Candle.

Candles are used during Advent in the Advent wreath and used as a reminder of the weeks of Advent and aid us to consider the time as not only Christmas approaches but as Christ's second coming draws near.

Candles play an important part in the imagery of the Epiphany because it is in this season Jesus is revealed as the light to the world. He is revealed as the Lamb of God and he is revealed as the God-man come to save his people.

And so you see that candles are an important part of our services. As you observe them in worship service may they help you to worship our Lord and Savior better by reminding you of these truths.

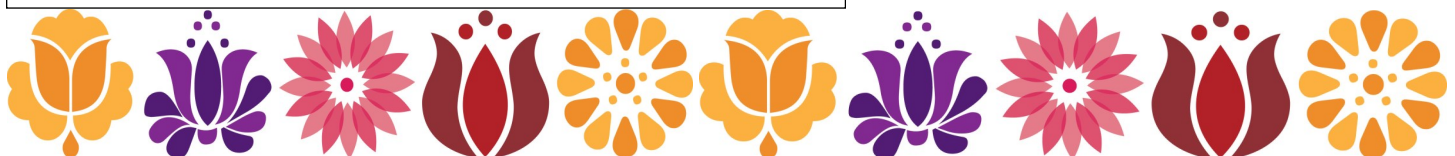

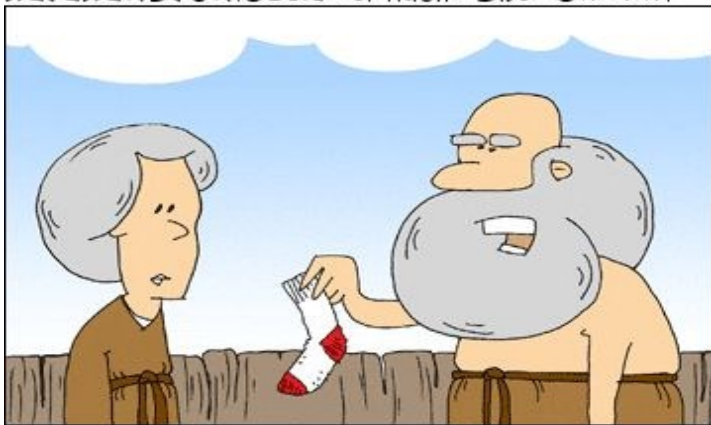

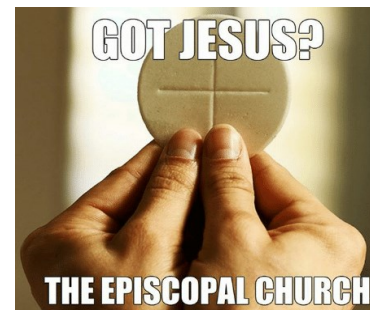
