From the Rector

Dear Friends,

What a crazy time we have experienced or I could say we are experiencing. For some people it has been a time of extreme frustration and for others it has been an opportunity for reflection upon how they have been living their lives. We have been told to disinfect everything that people touch and then have been told, "Ah never mind, the virus doesn't spread on surfaces." We have been told to keep masks on and yet we see countless people running around without masks. We heard that taking hydroxychloroquine would be helpful, then we heard it could be harmful and then later the health professionals said that yes, it could be helpful. We still really don't know enough about this virus apparently and the scientists are still making up their minds. I suppose that the crazy flipflops we are experiencing from dealing with this virus shouldn't be surprising because our scientists really only started studying it in February. That we know as much as we do in four months is actually amazing, yet because it has completely turned our society upside down economically and socially in these three short months people are frustrated and very concerned. Whole industries have been decimated. Hundreds of thousands of people have lost their jobs. And to make this bad situation worse we have an antagonistic political situation and civil unrest in an election year that has been set on fire by an irresponsible media. It is indeed a crazy time. Yet the good news is that as Christians we can still find peace in this very crazy time. How can we find peace, you may ask? It is a peace that Jesus talked about with his disciples, he said in John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither

let them be afraid." This statement by Jesus in and of itself is very comforting yet to see it in its context is even more helpful. Jesus says this on the night he was betrayed. He knew that within hours of saying these words he would be captured, beaten, convicted unjustly, and then crucified. Yet, he tells his disciples that he is giving them HIS peace. How could Jesus have peace at a time like that? His peace came from trusting in His Father. His peace came through his faith. Did his peace come from the realization that he was not going to suffer? Certainly not! He knew very clearly that he would have an extremely hard time just hours ahead. His peace came from trusting in God that all things were going to work out extremely well though certainly not in this lifetime or this world. He knew that the resurrection was coming. He knew that victory over sin, evil, and death was coming. And it was true that it would be hard and painful until that victory was won, but he had the confidence that the victory would be won. For his disciples and for us we too can have His peace. How can we have it? Well, we can have the confidence that Jesus did win the victory over sin, evil, and death. We KNOW he did because of His mighty resurrection! So whatever happens here is only temporary because the victory has been won. As it is written, "and this is the victory that overcomes the world, even our faith!" So even though we are going through a crazy time, an unprecedented time, we can have the peace of Jesus. It is possible that you and I may suffer somehow during this time. Still we need to remember in whom we trust. God is still in control of whatever happens. He still loves each of us very much so we can trust in Him to continue to care for us as we journey through this life to the next one where we will spend it with Him forever!
