From the Rector

Dear Friends,

It is hard to believe that it is June already. Like last year this one has been pretty strange and it feels odd now to be working our way back to normal. In fact, there seems to be no real consensus on what "normal" is anymore. Still it is really nice to be able to see people without masks again and to be able to see their faces, their expressions, and their smiles!

Bishop Smith has told us that for those who have been fully vaccinated we can begin to meet without masks and without social distancing. Furthermore after my last meeting with the clergy of our diocese I found out that we can begin singing in church once more! Although for those who have not been vaccinated it is still strongly encouraged that they continue with wearing masks and keeping socially distant from others.

I will once again begin holding the Adult Formation classes on Saturdays after the 4 pm service. The class begins around 5 pm. Craig Gates has offered to Zoom the Saturday class so those who are our snowbirds and those who are homebound are still able to attend class. The Sunday morning Adult Formation class begins at 9:15 am between the two Sunday morning services. (If you would like to join the Saturday class via Zoom, please let me know so you can receive a Zoom invitation.) The new series is on Symbols and Symbolism in the Holy Eucharist.

Our repairs are pretty much complete from the lightning strike we received in April. We are back up and running and better than before! God has indeed blessed us! Steve Smith and I have installed four new speakers in the church to provide for a more balanced sound. Hopefully everyone will be able to hear more clearly now.

We have entered the season after Pentecost. This is a "green" season, the season for growth. You may recall that we started the year with the season of Advent, looking forward to the coming of Christ. Then there

was the season of Christmas, the celebration of Jesus' first coming to earth. Then the season of Epiphany, the season of realizing that Jesus really is God in a human being. Then the season of Lent with the 40 days of where we considered those areas of our lives where we need to improve how we are living our Christian lives. Then we have the glorious season of Easter when we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. Pentecost we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit and now, now we have the season after Pentecost. Each season in its way celebrates or commemorates the life of Christ. In this season after Pentecost it is the life of Christ in His church; it is the life of Christ in us! This season takes us through the rest of our Christian year.

So what does growth look like for us as Christians? In this season we attempt to strengthen our Christian life through understanding better why we believe what we believe. As we understand our faith better we are less likely to falter and doubt in times of trouble and grief. During this season too is a good time to add a new discipline to our spiritual life. In the same way that an athlete or musician improves through the discipline of practice we as Christians need to work on improving our Christian walk of faith. We may want to add a discipline of a daily prayer time or to add praying for a particular person or situation to our current list. We may want to add a discipline of a daily time to read the Bible. There are other disciplines as well that we could add but those two are great ones with which to begin. Strengthening our faith and adding virtues are ways we grow as Christians in our faith.

Of course, regular church attendance helps us to grow in our faith as well and I hope that I continue to see more and more of you in church, particularly as this pandemic

winds down (thanks be to God).

Altar Guild

As Altar Guild members, we are sometimes asked about all kinds of things associated with the church, the vestments, preparation for the Eucharist and the Altar.

We are often asked about crucifix above the altar at St. Andrew's and why it does not portray anguish or misery as most representations of the crucifixion do. Ours is ly a Christus Rex.

The earliest depictions of the crucifixion show Christ upon the cross, with body erect and with arms stretched straight out. He is clothed either in a long robe or with a loin cloth. There is no attempt to be realistic or to emphasize suffering or agony.

The modern "Christus Rex" crucifix is in the same tradition. Christ stands erect in front of a cross, with arms straight out. The body may be clothed in modern, western Eucharistic vestments, and there may be a crown on the head.

The image portrays several concepts at the same time: the historic event of the crucifixion, Christ as the King in his kingdom, and Christ as the victorious sacrifice in the Eucharistic feast.

We are always available to answer questions and invite anyone interested in joining the Altar Guild to contact one of us or Fr. Lance.

Have a safe and healthy summer whether you stay here in Spring Hill or travel to another part of the country. May God's blessings be with you.

Members of the Pastoral Care Team each took a number of persons and called and/or sent cards each month. Over the past year the average number on the list was about 28.

This past month some facilities have opened up to visitation within strict guidelines. Each facility is a little different but we have been able to visit and bring communion and altar flowers to several people. Father Lance will continue to visit the hospitals as, understandably so, they still have strictly limited visitation guidelines. We continue cards, prayers and calls to the homebound. All our team have completed the vaccine protocol and are willing to visit individuals at their homes if they and other household members have completed the vaccine protocols.

In the fall we hope to welcome new team members as by then we hope to be further into our usual service. Over the next few months I ask you to read and meditate on Mathew 25:34-36 as well as talk to Fr Lance or me if you feel called to join us.




