# From the Rector

Dear Friends,

I am delighted to be able to say that the mask mandate for our church is officially over, at least for now. The bishop had asked us to wait to remove the mandate until the positivity rate in Florida was under 5.0 for two consecutive weeks. It now has been. The positivity rate has been dropping for eight weeks now and as of last Tuesday (10/19) Florida is at 3.8; the week before Florida was at 4.8. So we are happy to be able to move from masks mandated to masks recommended. Those who wish to wear masks are of course welcome to do so but if you would rather not, that's OK too. Every other row is still taped off so that we are able to continue to have social distance and I will still bring communion around to everyone, but we are moving in the right direction, thank Heaven. I am looking forward to having everyone come to the altar rail to receive communion once again, (the bread and the wine) but we will have to wait for that a little bit longer. It is a balancing act; on the one hand we want to move back to the way church was before COVID but on the other hand we still want to keep everyone safe.

We will have our traditional All Souls Day service in the Memorial Garden on November 2 at 10 am. In the service we pray for all the faithful departed souls and mention by name those who have died this past year from our church family and then people have listed on the sign-up paper in the Narthex. Please feel free to list any loved one you would like mentioned in our prayers.

We will begin another class of Episcopal Traditions starting on October 31 at noon. These classes are necessary to take if anyone would like to become an official member of St. Andrew's church. But the classes are not only for people who would like to become a member. These classes go through who we are here at St. Andrew's, and how we got to where we are. We talk about the history of our denomination, the history of the church, the traditions, the liturgy, the symbolism, the calendar, all sorts of fascinating things that make up who we are as Episcopalians. If you have been an Episcopalian all your life, there are probably some things of which you were not even aware about your faith. There are four classes, the first is October 31, the second, November 7, the third, November 14, and the final one will be November 28.

We will also have some training meetings in November. On November 13<sup>th</sup> at 1 pm we will have a training meeting for those interested in resuming their Order of St. Luke's ministries. And we will have a training meeting on November 20<sup>th</sup> for those who are our Greeters and Ushers also at 1 pm. Please feel free to attend a meeting even if you are not currently part of one of those ministries and yet are interested in serving in that way. In December we will have a meeting for readers. So if you are currently a reader or would like to be; keep an eye out for when that meeting will be scheduled.

November is always a great month because in it we have an entire day dedicated to being thankful. Over the past year I have become convinced that thankfulness should be one of a Christian's primary virtues. Being thankful changes a negative attitude to a positive one. It changes a complaint into a praise. Being thankful is an attractive and emboldening sort of feeling because when one is thankful one feels free to tell others what good thing has happened and joy is spread. God is pleased with a thankful spirit and blesses such a person with joy and contentment. So I encourage us all consciously to choose to be thankful. Spend time remembering the different ways God has blessed your life, not only on Thanksgiving, although certainly then too, but throughout the month and into next year. Let us all try to be more thankful for all that God has done for us.

On a final note, Diane and I are inviting any of you who would like to join us for Thanksgiving Dinner. We will have the dinner in Krysher Hall after the Thanksgiving service. There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex so we know how many to plan for. Turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy, cranberry relish, and marshmallow ambrosia will be provided, but you can feel free to bring a vegetable, dessert, or rolls and butter.


