From the Rector

Dear Friends,

I love the season of Advent, don't you? It has that New Year sort of feeling, fresh start and all of that. We have the beautiful blues for our Advent church altar hangings and vestments. We have the Advent candles and we begin the slow count-down until Christmas. It really is a great way to begin another Christian year. Unlike our society's new year which is a one night's party and then back to life as usual; we ease into our new year slowly. As the season progresses we have the time to consider our life, what we want out of the rest of our life, who we think we are, and where we want to go, spiritually, this year. We even have the time to consider this past year. How did I do? Was there an event that really changed my life and how will that affect my life this coming year?

As many of you know, the term 'Advent' means coming and it actually refers to the second coming of Jesus; it does not refer to Christmas at all. This is why the beautiful blue is a somber color because if we imagine Jesus arriving tomorrow, then our immediate thought is, "Am I ready?" Am I ready to actually see Jesus alive and in the flesh? What will he say to me? How will he react to how I have spent my life so far?" These are the questions that come to mind when we consider seeing Jesus for the first time. And these are sobering questions. They are actually the type of questions that we are supposed to be asking ourselves as we ease into a new year. I encourage you to do just that. This Advent season, enjoy it and savor it like a great cup of hot coffee on a cold morning. Spend time considering the important questions of life. Write down your thoughts and save them for review in six months or next year at this time.

Rose Sunday, the third Sunday of Advent (December 11), is the day we begin to turn from looking for Christ's return to remembering his first coming, hence



the rose color of joy. Then on Saturday, December 24 we have our two Christmas Eve services. The family service hosts a special guest, St. Nicholas, at 6 pm and at 9 pm the candlelight service begins. Each of those services are preceded by 30 minutes of Christmas carols (5:30 and 8:30). On Christmas Day we will have our usual 8 am and 10:30 services although they will be Rite One services (We will begin the service at 10:15 with Christmas carols so be sure to come a little early.) It will be glorious!

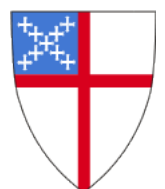

The Thrift Shop is still open and the backpack and food pantry will continue to serve during this month. We will be having our annual church Christmas party as well! We will have a dinner together in Krysher Hall starting around noon. And then after the meal has been all cleared away we will have our gift exchange. Everyone should bring a wrapped gift (between \$5 and \$10 in value). Our gift exchange is a so-called 'Yankee gift exchange' so if on your turn to choose a present you like one of the presents that has already been unwrapped you may take it and then that person will need to choose another one. It will be a busy time here at church and no doubt busy for you as well. Still even though it is a busy time, I encourage you to find some time to be quiet and enjoy this season of Advent!

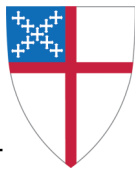
Ministry News

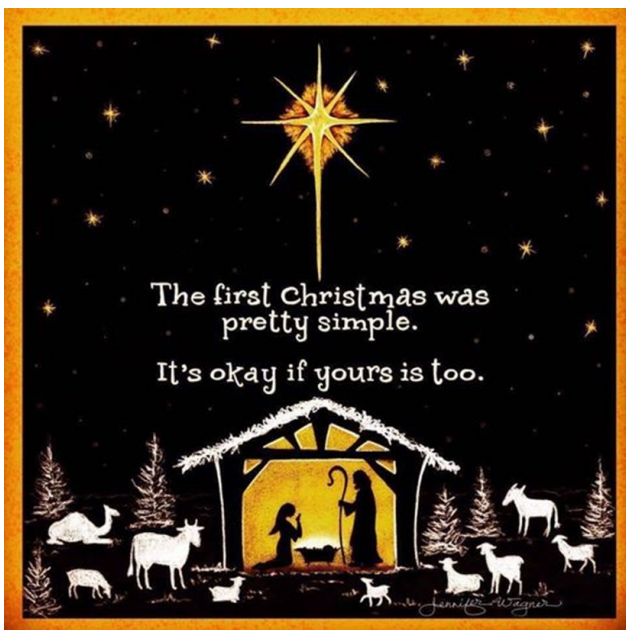

I love the church because of the friendliness of people. It shows faithfulness to the scripture and it creates and atmosphere of vibrant and meaningful worship.

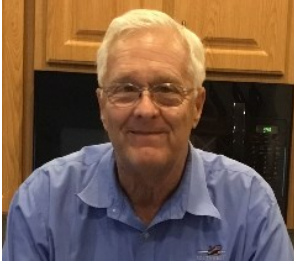
