From the Rector

Dear Friends,

This February is one without an Ash Wednesday. That hasn't happened since 2019. Typically Lent starts sometime in February. What that means of course is that we have the Season after Epiphany for a longer time. It is a blessing because it gives us more time to contemplate the Epiphany, that is, the significance of Jesus being God and a human. Now it is a fact that we are unable to completely understand how that really works. How can Jesus be completely God and completely human at the same time without mixture and without confusion? It is, as the ancients would say, "a mystery". But while we may have difficulty understanding how it happened exactly, we can understand why it is important to us. And it is important to us for several reasons.

The first is that if Jesus is God and Jesus is human, that means that God has experienced what happens to us as humans. No longer can we imagine a God who is unaware of how much something can hurt or what pain really feels like. God knows through personal experience because Jesus went through excruciating pain as he was tortured at the time of his execution. No longer can we imagine that God doesn't know what grief is like because Jesus lost a parent at a young age, and Jesus lost his friend, Lazarus as well and wept at his tomb. Jesus suffered rejection and being misunderstood by those who knew him best. Jesus understood betrayal by a close friend. Jesus suffered loneliness. So we know we have a God who knows our pain, our suffering, and loneliness. We know God understands us.

The second reason this is important is because if God is willing to lower himself to become a human for us and our salvation, it means that He loves us a lot more than we had ever expected. How much are you and I loved? Contemplate that God came down to earth and emptied Himself and became obedient even

to the point of death and not just death, but death on a cross! We talk about Jesus loving us but when we actually stop and consider it, when we stop and think that God Almighty would do this for us his rebellious creation, it boggles the mind. You and I are loved so much!

A third reason this is important is because since Jesus is fully God as well as human we can begin to understand what God is like. When we wonder how God feels about us and our behavior we look to see how Jesus responded to different people. We see how Jesus responded to the proud, the powerful, the sinners, the humble, the poor and the sick. He once told Philip that "if you have seen me you have seen the Father." In another place it is written that Jesus is the image of the invisible God. So looking at Jesus we see God. We see how God responds and how he thinks.

These are some of the reasons it is so important for Jesus being completely God and completely human. I hope you will make some time to think about this in this season and be filled with joy at the understanding of God's great love for you!

We are once again hopeful that COVID is in remission. The positivity rates seem to be plummeting again which is a really good sign. Once they have dropped below the 5 percent range again we will remove the tape from most of the church and resume coming to the altar for Holy Communion and begin serving both the bread and the wine. We will also resume Adult Formation. The first planned topic is on what God says about getting one's fortune read, and tarot cards, and all that sort of thing. Does God care about this or is it is non-issue? We will check it out to see what the Bible has to say on this. I am also hopeful that we can begin a mid-week Bible study in February. These will hopefully take place along with the men's group meetings and the single women's group meetings which still are meeting even now.
