# From the Rector

Are you a New Year's resolution maker? Many people make goals about fitness, weight loss, or time management. The experience of crafting goals can be exciting as we look ahead to a future we hope will be different from the present. Others find this kind of goal-setting stressful and unappealing. The idea of making New Year's resolutions just sounds oppressive and guilt-inducing. These folks enjoy the freedom of simply going on as before. However, even realizing there are folks who are not eager to change, I would like to recommend some goals of much greater value than getting physically fit or utilizing their time better. These sorts of goals are for all of us, whether we're resolution makers or free spirits.

The first goal I recommend is to make time to read some of the Bible at least several times a week and not just wait to hear God's word until we get to church. As followers of Jesus it is important that we learn what He actually taught us and how we should be living. We learn these things by reading what Jesus said in the gospels and then what his apostles taught in their letters.

Another resolution I recommend is to pray every day. In your prayers include several things. First ask God to help you understand how much He loves you. It is vitally important for us to understand the love of God in order for us to grow spiritually. In fact the more we grasp love of God, the more we feel God's presence and peace in our lives. I also commend praying for someone about something specific. Choose someone about whom God has made you concerned and resolve to pray for him or her during your daily prayer time. At this time next year you will be amazed at what has happened. And finally in your prayer time ask God to help you grow in your faith and ask Him to help

you to be more kind and loving to others. On your prayer list please continue to pray for me as your pastor and priest and pray for St. Andrew's that we will continue to grow so that Jesus Christ will be honored through our lives and church.

Starting a new year is always an exciting thing. What will it be like? What new things will happen? How will God work in us as a church and in each of us individually? In our church we are looking forward to continuing to open back up. I am hoping to begin Adult Bible studies once again. We are hoping to begin the ministry of Order of St. Luke's again. We are hoping to be able to offer the wine during Holy Communion again! Yet even as we look forward to those good things we are bracing for the new Omicron variant. And because of that, I cannot say when all of our ministries will, in fact, open again. Still, we are confident that God will continue to work everything out because He has called us into His service! May God grant you a blessed New Year full of joy and peace!

## Buildings & Grounds






### Women's Bible Study Starting in January




