From the Rector

Dear Friends,

According to our church calendar, November is the last month of the



church year. The first Sunday of Advent occurs on November 27th and on that day we begin a new church year. As the last month of the year, it is very appropriate that November be a month known for giving thanks. We start this thankfulness on November 2nd when we observe the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed; this is also known as All Souls' Day. It is on this day we make a point of remembering those who have passed into the nearer presence of the Lord. This service is held at 10 am in the Memorial Garden. And although we simply say their names in the service, it is a time for us to remember and be thankful for their lives and for the blessing their lives have been to us. Typically we remember things about the lives of our loved ones when we have the funeral services, but it is over the days and weeks and months and even the years that pass that things come to mind about those dearly departed. These memories may make us smile, even laugh, or they may tug at our hearts. On All Souls' Day we gather those memories up again and thank God for letting us have the time with our departed loved ones that we did.

And then there is the grand Thanksgiving Day itself towards the end of the month. Some of us have different traditions on how each of our families observe Thanksgiving but no matter how it is observed Thanksgiving Day should be understood as a gift for us. It is a day that we have been given to be thankful to God for his blessings to us. Do you know that in the Bible one of the main faults God found with his people the Israelites was that they were not thankful? We are told over and over again to be thankful both in the Old Testament and in the New Testament. Is this command given to us because somehow God needs our thanks? No, God

wants us to have thankful hearts because being thankful is the primary source of joy and contentment. If you and I want to feel joy and contentment, then we need to learn to be thankful. Thankfulness is not an automatic response for most of us. We need to make a conscious effort to notice things around us and consciously be appreciative to others and to God.

And thinking of things to be thankful for, this year we will continue a tradition that we started just last year. We will have a church family Thanksgiving meal together! If you are alone or it is just you and your spouse, come and join Diane and me for a Thanksgiving meal here at the church in Krysher Hall. There will be turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes, gravy, green beans, and then if you would like to bring a salad and/or your favorite dessert to share that would be great. There is a sign-up sheet in the narthex so that we make sure to have enough turkey and mashed potatoes for all who are coming. We will have the Thanksgiving Dinner at noon right after our Thanksgiving Day service. This year our service will start at 11 am and our Thanksgiving Dinner will begin around noon. The Thanksgiving Day service is Rite 1 and many of you enjoy the rich language and wording of that service.

Again thinking of things to be thankful for we are thankful that God gave us the opportunity to know and love Charlene and Fr. Don. There will be a celebration of life for Charlene Moore on November 6th after the 10:30 service followed by a potluck dinner. On November 19th at 11 am there will be a funeral service for Fr. Don Lillpopp.

A thankful heart is a happy heart. Let's ask our heavenly Father to help us to be more thankful for all the good things he has given us.

The Pastoral Team wishes you a November full of thankfulness and gratitude. In the beginning of the month we remember those loved ones that have gone to the greater presence of the Lord and pray to realize how thankful we are to have shared our lives with them. At the end of the month we have Thanksgiving and remind ourselves of our many

blessings in gratitude as we prepare for the Christmas season.

The Pastoral Care Ministry is dedicated to bringing the presence of Christ to parishioners that are unable to come to regular services either on a temporary or on-going basis. This follows the tradition of the earliest Christians bringing bread and wine from services to those unable to come.

Many of our members are licensed Lay Eucharistic visitors and bring communion. Some of our members also belong to the Order of Saint Luke and are also able to anoint for healing. That being said, it is not necessary to be or do either.

We provide visits to the homebound, hospitalized, those in rehab or extended care facilities. We meet bi-monthly during the regular church year. Training and screening is required of anyone wishing to join this rewarding and important ministry. CHURCH YARD SALE

The church yard sale held on October 21 was successful. Eleven parishioners, as well as the Thrift Shop, participated in the yard sale. It was well attended by the community and the church made \$166 from the sale. We are planning to do this again in next spring.

DOLLARS SENSE

To those who have IRA accounts and are required to take your minimum distribution every year: Because of the large increase in standard deductions under the new tax law, you should consider setting up a qualified charitable distribution, or QCD. (St. Andrew's is a qualified charitable distribution.)

A QCD is when your IRA custodian (Raymond James or whoever) sends part of your required distribution from your IRA directly to the charity vou have chosen. So let's say you must take out \$4,000 from your IRA for 2022 as a required distribution and you normally give your church \$1,200 in donations for the year. You would contact your custodian and tell them to give the \$1,200 donation from your IRA and they will mail to your church on your behalf and then you would get the residual \$2,800.

Why would you do this? Under the new tax laws, you probably will not be able to deduct the \$1,200 donation. If you do the QCD however, the church receives their money and you do not pay tax on the \$1,200 required distribution from the IRA. This will save you taxes due next year. Something to think and pray about.

Connie's Famous Potato Soup

1 28oz. package frozen Potatoes O'Brien

1 packet Country Gravy Mix4 tsp. Chicken Base(I used Better Than Bullion)32 oz. water or 32 oz. chicken broth

Mix all ingredients together in a large pot.

Bring to a boil, stirring occasionally

Once it's boiling, reduce heat and let it simmer until it begins to thicken. Soup will continue to thicken as it cools.


