




### From the Rector





Our first weekend of February we will have a visit from our new diocesan bishop, Bishop Doug Scharf! While he is here he will receive as members eleven people, Jim and Sherry Cortier, Jack and Helen Evans, Mark Kirchner, Eva Ronacher, Barbara Schulwitz, Carolyn Small, David and Cecillia Soch, and Bonnie Staveski. We are delighted to welcome them as new members of St. Andrews. I hope you will all be able to attend the 10:30 service to see our new bishop and then to stay after to come to our welcome reception for our new members!

In February we will have a Valentine's Day dinner and dance on the 14th. It is for everyone, singles and couples alike. Come and join us for food and fun. The cost is only \$5 at the door to help defray the costs for the ham and potatoes. Please bring your favorite dessert and/or salad to share.

The very next Tuesday, February 21st is Shrove Tuesday and there will be our traditional pancake dinner this year sponsored by the men's group. So if you like pancakes and sausages, you will love it. I hope to see you there.

Of course the very next day is Ash Wednesday. We will have two services as usual. There will be the 10 am service and the 6 pm service. Ashes will be imposed at both services. For me Ash Wednesday is one of the most moving services in our church year; I hope you can attend. This day is one of two days in our Episcopal calendar when fast-

ing is recommended. (The other day for fasting is Good Friday.)

I suspect for most people February is all about Valentine's Day. It is one of the most popular holidays in our culture. Today Valentine's Day is all about cards, hearts, flowers and chocolate. But you might be surprised to know that actually there was a person named Valentine. He lived some two hundred years after Jesus ascended into heaven. He was a priest in the church in Rome. In those days, the Emperor Claudius had an edict against his soldiers being married. He thought they would fight more courageously and loyally if they did not have a family about which they were concerned.

Christianity has always been strongly in favor of marriage. Fr. Valentine taught the people that God wanted men and women to marry before they lived together. Further Fr. Valentine married Christian soldiers in spite of the Emperor's edict in order to be obedient to God. He was caught and imprisoned. While he was in prison, it came to his attention that the jailor's daughter was blind. So Valentine prayed that she would be healed and she was! Her sight was restored. It was such a remarkable miracle that the jailor himself along with his daughter became Christians.


Valentine though was convicted and sentenced to die on February 14, 269. On the morning he was to die, he sent a short letter to the jailor's daughter encouraging her in her Christian faith and he signed it, "from your Valentine." Our culture has pretty much forgotten everything about Valentine's story except how he signed his last letter. Fr. Valentine was made a saint in 496 by Pope Gelasius and is considered the patron saint of lovers.

I am not certain St. Valentine would like to be considered the patron saint of lovers before anything else. I am sure he would rather to be considered the patron saint of those who want to be obedient to God no matter what the costs. Even as we remember and celebrate Valentine's Day this year, I would like us to renew our desire to

obey our Lord Jesus and be obedient like Fr. Valentine.
