From the Rector



Dear Friends,

Summer time is upon us. By this time the snow birds have gone back to their homes up north and many of us will be taking vacations and spending time away from our homes too. Taking time to relax and get out of our normal day to day routines can be very helpful to us. Even if we don't get away, changing things up for a little while is healthy. There was a time when Jesus and his disciples had been through a hard several weeks and Jesus suggested to his disciples that they all "get away to a quiet place." The reason changing things up for a while can be healthy is because then when we return we can see our routines with a new eye. Perhaps we can reevaluate how we have been going about what we have been doing. This is especially appropriate for us as Christians because we are now entering the Season after Pentecost which is a green season. This green season is also known as ordinary time.

This season is about the life of Christ in His church; it is the time we pray for the Holy Spirit to work in and through us! Remember Jesus told his disciples that He would not leave them as orphans but would send them His Spirit. His Spirit is the Holy Spirit. So this season is the season where we particularly consider how the Holy Spirit wants to work in us. Since the color of this season is green it reminds us that we should be looking for ways to grow through dependence on and through guidance of the Holy Spirit.

So what does growth look like for us as Christians? Growing in our Christian life can be misunderstood. Sometimes we confuse simply learning more about the Bible with growing as a Christian. But in reality we grow as Christians through developing a better relationship with our Lord Jesus. It is very important to know the Scriptures and know what God tells us to do, but that is not what relationship with God, relationship with Jesus is all about. We can know what to do; we can know all kinds of Bible verses and where things are in the Bible, but what is really important is to really know and love Jesus. Our Christianity can either be from our heads or from our hearts. Remember our Lord criticized the Pharisees because they approached their relationship with God with their heads, with their do's and

don'ts. But it is our hearts that God wants. And in that regard it is important to be aware of His presence around us and to find joy in speaking to Him. There is a little book (less than 50 pages) called, The Practice of the Presence of God that was written by a humble friar named Brother Lawrence in the 1600's. In this book Brother Lawrence does not deal with theological or doctrinal issues. His one single aim was to bring about a conscious personal union between himself and God. I commend the book, especially the letters part, as a help and even a guide to give you direction in growing your relationship with the Lord. (The book can be read for free online; or if you order it look for the modern version.)

But however one works at it, learning to love and know the Lord better is the most important aspect of our Christian life. When we read the Scripture, we need to then stop and meditate on what God may be saying to us; when we pray, we need to stop and wait for Him to fill us with His presence and strength; when we come to church, we come to hear His word explained and then take Holy Communion to receive His presence into us. These are ways for us to love and know the Lord better. And this is to be the focus of our Christian life during this season.

During June, July and August we give the Adult Bible study a break and will resume in September. The Adult Formation classes will take a break during June when I am on vacation but will resume sometime in July. But our church services continue without any breaks! Please make sure that you feed your souls and spirits by coming to church regularly this summer. Fr. Fred will be leading the services in June and I will be back in July.

This is the summer edition of the Chimes and includes both June and July. Looking forward I hope you will plan to join your church family for a picnic on the patio on June 17th. And then we will have a 4th of July pot luck picnic in Krysher Hall. On July 19th we will have a Jeopardy or Trivia Game night with sandwiches. So we have some great times planned for this summer and I hope you will plan to join them all or at least as many as you are able.



THE STUDY OF SAINTS



Saint Peter (c. 1610-1612) by Peter Paul Rubens

On June 29 we commemorate the martyrdom of St. Peter and St. Paul. Both of these men were executed under Nero sometime in the mid-sixties in Rome. Paul was beheaded and Peter was crucified. Legend has it that Peter asked to be crucified upside down because he said he was unworthy to be

executed in the same way as his Lord Jesus was.

bonds, had been driven into exile, had been stoned, had preached in the East and in the West, he won the noble renown which was the reward of his faith, having taught righteousness unto the whole world and having reached the farthest bounds of the West; and when he had borne his testimony before the rulers, so he departed from the world and went unto the holy place, having been found a notable pattern of patient endurance."

Clement of Rome wrote about this event some 30 years later. "Let us come to those champions who lived nearest to our time. Let us set before us the noble examples which belong to our generation. By reason of jealousy and envy the greatest and most righteous pillars of the Church were persecuted, and contended even unto death. Let us set before our eyes the good Apostles. There was Peter who by reason of unrighteous jealousy endured not one not one but many labors, and thus having borne his testimony went to his appointed place of glory. By reason of jealousy and strife Paul by his example pointed out the prize of patient endurance. After that he had been seven times in

The theme of patient endurance is apparent in both Apostles' lives and deaths. All of us endure. All of us go through times of trial and as we age, those times grow more frequent. However, As St. Clement points out for us, it is important as followers of Jesus to have patient endurance. To go through the struggles of life grumbling and complaining is not showing patient endurance. No, we need to find things in our day to day lives for which to thankful. We need to remember to give thanks to those who help us. We need to be grateful for our creation, our lives, and our salvation. It is having that gratitude that will enable us to be more like the great saints who through their lives and deaths gave us good examples to follow.
