From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Last week we observed Ash Wednesday and many of you came to church and had ashes imposed upon your forehead. You heard either me or Fr. Fred say to you, "From dust you came and to dust you shall return." We were solemnly reminded of our mortality; we were reminded that we will all die one day. And then on the first Sunday of Lent we heard how Jesus fasted for 40 days and then was tested by the Evil One. His 40 days of fasting is the template for our Lenten season.

Jesus never gave us the commandment to fast for 40 days like He did, thank Heaven. But in the early church the season of Lent was instituted to remind Christians not only of the fasting that our Lord Jesus did, but take time to meditate about our lives. We need to think about how we are living, how we are spending our time and money, and to examine the thoughts and intents of our hearts. We are encouraged to do some fasting and to do much praying. Many of us "fast" from eating chocolate or drinking wine or going on Facebook or something that we really enjoy during Lent. And it is a good thing to exercise self-control. But in our fasting we need to remember the point of why. We are to be fasting to grow closer to God and to become more like Jesus. During those times when we desire the chocolate or wine or to see what's happening on Facebook, it is then we are to pray. So the idea is that when we want these things a lot then we will get lots of prayers said! The goal of self-denial is to grow closer to God and to become more like Jesus.

On Ash Wednesday we are reminded that we are mortal; we are going to die. But that isn't the whole story is it? The Lenten season is 40 days long and at the end of those 40 days is Easter. If Ash Wednesday is the day we acknowledge our mortality; Easter is the day we celebrate our immortality through the victory of

Jesus defeating Death! And we are both aren't we? We are both mortal and immortal. The ultimate point of Lent is to prepare us for our immortality. We try to exercise self-control over certain habits in order to develop better Christian habits like prayer and thankfulness and giving. We do this because even though this sort of self-denial is not particularly enjoyable we are to be looking beyond this discomfort to our goal and our goal is immortality! Our goal is to become citizens of the Kingdom of Jesus that He will establish here on the earth at the end of time! In the book of Hebrews we are told that Jesus endured the shame and agony of the cross for the joy that was set before him. In the same way, I want us to see beyond the discomforts of Lent to Easter, in fact, to see all the way to the joy of heaven.

There is somberness in Lent as reflected by our Lenten colors and our Lenten exercises, yet we are to remember that Easter is just there on the horizon. So indeed let us work at our different areas of self-denial and develop better Christian habits of prayer, Bible reading, thankfulness or whatever habit needs development in our lives. There are Lenten booklets to help us in our daily meditations in the narthex. But let us also remember the underlying theme of joy! We are preparing our souls for the joys of heaven! May you have a Holy Lenten season!



Generally, there are 40 residents at the shelter; half of which are children ages 4 - 10, who, in addition to "undies," need new socks. Our congregation can make a tremendous difference in the lives of these individuals.


