Dear Friends,

November is always a great month

because in it we have an entire day dedicated to being thankful. Lately I have been using St. Ignatius's Daily Examen for a daily prayer guide. One of the primary components of this prayer is looking back over one's day, seeing God at work in and through all the day's events; then being thankful for His presence and help. Being thankful changes a negative attitude to a positive one. It changes a complaint into praise. Being thankful is an attractive and emboldening sort of feeling because when one is thankful one feels free to tell others what good thing has happened and joy is spread. God is pleased with a thankful spirit and blesses such a person with joy and contentment. So I encourage us all consciously to choose to be thankful. Spend time remembering the different ways God has blessed your life, not only on Thanksgiving, although certainly then too, but throughout the month and into next year. Let us all try to be more thankful for all that God has done for us.

In particular it is appropriate for us to be thankful for all God has done for us here at St. Andrew's. As I have said, I am retiring at the end of December. SEARCHING FOR OUR NEW RECTOR

Dear St. Andrew's family,

As a parishioner of St. Andrew's, you are being asked to participate in the first step of our search for a new Rector, which is to conduct a congregational assessment. This assessment will provide a clear picture of who we are as a church and what directions are most important for our future. The tool we'll use is the Congregation Assessment Tool (CAT). This assessment is required by the Diocese and will provide key indicators of our congregational health along with areas of challenge and potential growth. It will help us to collect and understand the range of views that exist at St. Andrew's and the possibilities, will-ingness, capacity and energy for moving our ministry into the future.

If you have provided us with a current email address, you will be notified when your unique web link is available to complete the assessment online. If you need to update your contact information please contact the church office. Electronic completion of the survey is the preferred method due to cost and ease of compiling the information. If you need to take the assessment using a paper copy, when they become available, please stop by the office to get one or we will have them available at our weekly services. Please keep in mind, these assessments **ARE NOT YET AVAILABLE** to access in any form.

NOTE: If there is only one email address for all members of your household, it may be tempting to have one person take the survey on behalf of the family. However, please be sure adults and young adults living in your home have an opportunity to complete the survey. **INDIVIDUAL INPUT** is important to gain insight into overall perceptions and experiences.

Please set aside enough time to answer all the questions. This will take about 15-20 minutes. All survey responses are strictly anonymous and confidential.

Thank you for your willingness to be a part of this congregational assessment and for helping to build the future of St. Andrew's.

Treasurer's Tidbits

In my stewardship talk last month, I said I wasn't going to talk about money at that time. Well, now is the time! As I indicated, the gifts you give back to God are used to support St. Andrew's and its ministries. The church depends on the congregation's financial support to pay for operating expenses such as utilities, supplies, postage, computer and payroll support, to name a few, as well as expenses associated with church ministries such as bible studies, food pantry, altar guild, music, women's and men's groups and more.

Monthly operating expenses continue to rise. The insurance premium for next year alone has increased \$19,700 over this year. The church will be going through a transition next year but that does not mean that the church will not continue to operate as normal. We will still have bills to pay and ministries to support. So please do not let the unknown influence your decision to support the church.

In order to formulate the most accurate budget we can, I urge anyone who has not pledged in the past but has consistently given to the church, to consider pledging this year. Your intention of giving to God in thanksgiving and gratitude for all He has given you can also be a commitment to the church.

It is hard to believe that Christmas is just around the corner! And so we are gearing up for this year's Angel Tree Program. The tree with angels will be available in the narthex beginning November 11. As in the past,



you may choose an angel from the tree and purchase the gift yourself or make a monetary donation and the purchase will be done for you by the Angel Tree Committee.
