weather is cooler and in the early mornings there is a slight chill in the air. I am glad to report that our ministries are back and operating once more. The Thrift Store is open five days a week, (Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Saturday), the Backpack ministry is packing those backpacks for the kids at Deltona Elementary (well, not the backpacks, they are packing bags now), the food pantry is giving away food to needy pre-school families, the pastoral team is visiting those who are sick and shut-in, the altar guild is setting up the altar for every service, the greeters are greeting people as they come into church, our camera people are beaming out our services to those who want to be here but cannot, our child care folks are taking care of the children during church service, the audio people are making sure the sound levels are right for people to hear our service, the computer operators are making sure we are all on the same page, the women's Bible study is meeting, the men's group is meeting, the adult Bible study and Adult Formation class are meeting, and our choir is rehearsing again too. But wait, there's more! In October we will start Episcopal Traditions once again. This class is for any who are interested in becoming members of St. Andrew's Church. We will meet after 10:30 Sunday morning service for about 30 to 40 minutes on October 8, 22, 29 and November 5. There will be a sign-up sheet in the narthex for those interested. There are great things happening. God has been so good to us here at St. Andrew's!

October begins our annual stewardship month. Craig Gates, the senior warden, and I will be sending out letters to the congregation and the pledge cards will be sent too. Stewardship month can be either a time of joy or of discomfort. I hope it will be a time of joy for you! As I have said in the past, giving is a sign of spiritual health. We want to be able to give back to God. It is not supposed to be a matter of having to do something, like a wearisome chore; instead it should be a matter of being able or even getting to do something, as in being able to join in at a party. God understands that on the one hand we need money to survive, to pay our bills and buy our food and shelter. Yet throughout Scripture we are warned that money can get too strong a grip on our souls and that at least is one reason God set up the tithe, so that we have a good channel to be able to give our money away. Tithe is an odd and old fashioned word. It simply means "a tenth part of something paid as a voluntary contribution usually for the support of a religious establishment." Giving ten percent goes back to Abraham, the father of faith. He gave ten percent to the high priest Melchizedek as a way to say thank you to God for helping him win a battle. Ever since then, the tithe was considered a standard for us to follow. In the New Testament the example and encouragement of giving continues and is still with us. We therefore have tithes and then offerings which is when we give over and above the tithe. As I will say in my congregational letter, I want you to pray about what you will give. Talk to God and ask Him to give you a thankful and joyful heart so that when you give it will be a joyful experience.

We are looking forward to some special events in October. Along with our regular busy schedule we will have a harvest/Halloween dinner-dance party on October 27th. There will be more details coming soon but make sure to keep that date open so you can spend some fun time with your church family.

Let us continue to grow as a church; let us grow in our love for God, in love for each other, and in love for those in our community.

Our fall church year is off to a wonderful start. We are worshipping together, learning together and playing together. Please remember our parishioners that are not able to join us. If you know of someone who lives near you offer them a ride or if they are not able to attend any of the services or activities, offer to bring them a bulletin every week or give them a call with any news or share with them about one of the activites you have attended.

The Pastoral Care Ministry is dedicated to bringing the presence of Christ to parishioners that are unable to come to regular services either on a temporary or on-going basis. This follows the tradition of the earliest Christians bringing bread and wine from services to those unable to come.

Many of our members are licensed Lay Eucharistic visitors and bring communion. Some of our members also belong to the Order of Saint Luke and are also able to anoint for healing. That being said, it is not necessary to be or do either. There is always giving the gift of your bringing prayer and the presence of Christ to them.

We provide visits to the homebound, hospitalized, those in rehab or extended care facilities. We meet bimonthly during the regular church year. Training and screening is required of anyone wishing to join this rewarding and important ministry. Boy Scout Troop 433

Happy Autumn everyone and welcome to Boy Scout Troop 433. Perhaps you did not know, or you are vaguely aware that a Boy Scout troop meets here at St. Andrew's church.



Here is a brief history of

how Troop 433 came into existence. The Troop was chartered on March 28, 1988, by Father Robin Murray, Rector of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, 2301 Deltona Blvd., Spring Hill, FL., and Unit Commissioner Mr. Richard Vaillancourt of the Withlacoochee District of the Greater Tampa Bay Area Council of the Boy Scouts of America. This is the thirty-fifth year of the Troop.

St. Andrew's Church is the Charter Organization that owns the rights to the Troop. The Chief Executive Officer (Father Lance) and the Charter Organization (St. Andrew's church) are represented to the Boy Scout Council and the Troop by a person known as the Charter Organization Representative. This person is also a member of the Adult Leadership committee for the Troop. The COR collaborates closely with the Troop Committee Chair, Church Administrator, and Rector; aids

the Troop Committee in the annual re-charter process; signs adult applications; stays in communications with the Council Office about the adult leaders.

The Troop meets every Monday at 7:00 p.m. in Krysher Hall. There are currently 24 boys involved in the Troop. The Troop is "boy" led which means the older scouts take on leadership positions. The boys are supervised under the direction of the Scout Master and Assistant Scout Masters.

Currently none of the Scouts or Adult leaders are members of St. Andrew's church but, Troop 433 continues to be a part of the youth outreach ministry that Father Murray began in 1988.

If you are wondering why I am authoring this article it is because I volunteered to become the COR for St. Andrew's with Father Lance's blessing and approval. Prior to my retiring from my ministry practice in 2019 I had volunteered with Boy Scouts of America for 34 years.


