THE OLD TESTAMENT

Sixth of a series on the Bible, helping us to develop a better understanding of Bible writers, locations and themes of the various books.

Last January, we began the series on the Bible, beginning with the Old Testament. The first section (which we completed last month) consisted of the first five books of the Bible. These books are known collectively as **The Law**. Tradition states that these were written by Moses, although many scholars believe they were oral history which was written down several hundred years after Moses' time. The books were written some 1400 years before Christ and take place in the areas of the Middle East: Egypt, Jordan, Syria and present day Israel.

As a reminder, the first five books are **Genesis**: God begins His Earthly work

through creation and the establishment of His plan; **Exodus**: God redeems His people; **Leviticus**: God provides the framework for true and holy worship; **Numbers**: God chastens His people in love; and finally **Deuteronomy**: God shows His love for His people.

The next two-thirds of the Old Testament consist of two sections referred to as **The Prophets** and **The Writings**.

We are going to divide The Writings into two sections: *History* and *Poetry*.

The *History* section is a record of Israel's spiritual growth and decline, covering the years from approximately 1405 BC to approximately 435 BC.

The *Poetry* section is a record of the worship of the God of Israel and of individual faith. This section covers

the years approximately 1410 BC through 430 BC. This section will cover the authors of the books of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes and the Song of Solomon.

Finally this portion of our journey through the Old Testament will end with *The Prophets*. This section will look at the God of Israel's revelations of His blessings, judgments and promises.

Next month, the *From the Deacon's Bench* will begin with the history portion. It will consist of a list of the books, possible author, approximate years, and a statement giving the overall idea of each book.

I do hope and pray that when we finish our journey through the Bible, each of us will have a better understanding of the Bible.
