Sr. Warden's Remarks

Parish surveys have been returned rather slowly. We distributed 423 surveys. The surveys will be tallied, any and all comments recorded, and these results will be distributed by mid-August.

The next step is to analyze the survey results. How does this differ from counting? And what is the purpose? Analyzing goes beyond counting. It looks at the responses from multiple questions to help form the overall need or desire of the parishioners. All comments are being recorded and will be published verbatim. From the analysis, a set of criteria can be formed that will become the directive for the diocese and the search committee when we move to the next step.

Thank you to all who have expressed a willingness to serve on the search committee.

St Andrew's received a very generous bequest. The vestry decided to 1) set aside the funds to cover the diocesan assessment on this bequest, 2) set an amount into a designated fund for major repairs of the future (ex. Air conditioner replacement, and 3) set a specified amount into a major maintenance/repair fund. Major repairs are defined as being greater than \$1000 in cost. You should begin to see the results of this last fund around the campus.
