I loved sitting back there. I was alone. I could read without my sisters bugging me. Sometimes I couldn't hear the conversation up front, so when someone was trying to get my attention, I could pretend I didn't hear them.

One thing always bothered me. I was always looking backward. I didn't see things until they had already passed us by. I couldn't say, "Let's stop here" because it was already gone.

You see, I was always looking backward. I only saw things from the past. I couldn't see what was coming, and I couldn't join the conversation about where to go. Eventually, my sisters moved on and I could sit in the back seat looking forward. I could see what my parents were seeing. I could suggest places to go before we had passed them. If I wanted to see

something we'd gone by, I could turn around, but mostly I looked toward what was coming in the future. I really felt a part of the journey.

Have you ever thought about the fact that God created us in such a way that our eyes point in the same direction as our feet? Can you imagine the chaos that would reign if our face pointed the same way as our back-side?

Remembering where we've been is good. It helps us learn what to look for ahead of us. But, looking backward can blind us from the amazing things coming up. It also can cause us to bump into things that could be easily avoided.

We can't do anything about the past except learn from it. If we live in the present with our eyes, feet and hearts facing the future, we can prepare for what is coming and anxiously look forward to where we want to be.

It has been so nice to be with you. Peace & Love



The Old Testament

This month brings us to an end of a journey through the Old Testament which we started in January. The last section of the Old Testament is referred to as "The Prophets". This section contains 17 books. Many of the books are very familiar to us because many Sundays we hear a portion of these books read to us, while many are rarely heard. One of the reasons for so many books being included is that the Hebrews understood that prophecy to be the <u>forth telling</u> from God as well as <u>foretelling</u>. Secondly, the term "prophets" stands as an overall title for an entire section of sacred writings even though some books may not be of a predict ive nature.

The "Prophets" provide the Lord, God of Israel's revelations of His blessings, judgments and promises.
