Once received, the Diocese will post the profile on their web site and will review the profile and begin their search of possible candidates. This is the first attempt at matching the needs of St. Andrew's with what is available. A search committee will be named. The Diocese will forward to the search committee as many possible candidates as they can find. The search committee reviews and does their own attempt at matching needs and

available candidates. Outside candidates may also apply based upon their review of the profile that is posted. Actual interviews by the search committee will take place when candidates have been narrowed down. For this to take 1 to 2 years is quite common. Meanwhile our priestin-charge will be in charge.


