I would like to encourage those of you who have not attended the Bible study on James to begin. It is a discussion-based study on the text of James. James is a fascinating book. It was not only the first New Testament book written, it was written as a Christian handbook for the early believers and as such provides us great insight into how the early church viewed what Christian life should look like. It is a wonderful study for us to begin during Lent.

In our Ten Commandments study we are now ready to begin commandment number five on March 10th. The plan is to cover commands five and six on the 10th, commands seven and eight on the 17th and commands nine and ten on the 24th the last class. If you have not yet attended, please come! We would love to hear your thoughts and you would benefit from hearing God's words explained.

Holy Week is coming up fast! Please make plans to join as many of the many services that you can! We start Holy Week with the Liturgy of the Palms on Palm Sunday (and the Saturday 4 pm service). Then on Monday there will be a Rite One service at noon for those who can attend during the day and at 6 pm for those who cannot attend during the day. Tuesday and Wednesday the James study continues. Of course also on Wednesday is the 10 am Holy Eucharist service with prayers for healing. Thursday is the Maundy Thursday service. We will have a soup supper at 6 and then Holy Eucharist with foot washing at 7 pm. Good Friday we have a liturgy at noon with a Stations of the Cross service beginning at 1pm. Holy Saturday liturgy begins at 5 pm in the Memorial Garden and at 5:30 pm there is the flowering of the cross. And the culmination of the week is on Easter Sunday! It begins at 6 am with the Great Vigil. Then at 8 am the early Holy Eucharist Easter Service is held. At 9:30 am there is the traditional Easter egg hunt and finally at 10:30 am we have our Easter Service.

Easter is the most important day of the year for Christians. Because obviously without Easter, without Jesus rising from the dead, there is no Christianity. But Jesus did rise from the dead! So celebrate along with us and the rest of the body of Christ throughout the world!

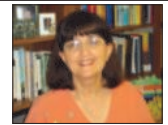

St. Andrew's VPK, Preschool and Child Care News

Those of you who attended January's Annual Meeting heard the sad news that our beloved school would close in June if current things did not change. This news has broken our hearts. As you may know, the school will be 40 years old in September, and is probably St. Andrew's oldest ministry.

It occurred to me that I have been here for 30 of those 40 years, but that many of you are new here and probably do not know our history. The school was always a children's ministry reaching out to young families in this widespread, predominantly senior-citizen community. Our original rector, The Rev. Ernie Bennett, saw the need for a place for young children to go, and his wife Rosalyn founded our school all those years ago. What started as a one-day-a-week gathering of young mothers and their preschool children evolved into a five-day-a-week successful preschool serving two, three, and four-year old children.

In 1997 under rector The Rev. Robin

Murray, we became a full-time child care as well. Later we applied for and were given a contract for the state-funded VPK (Voluntary Pre-Kindergarten) program, which we are proud to continue today. Our long, well-deserved, excellent reputation for early childhood education in a Christian setting is what draws families and students today. You should know that one of our families this year drives all the way from Homasassa Springs because of our reputation.

In the past 40 years our school has served over 1,500 children and has had a positive impact on hundreds of families for Christ. Only God knows how many people St. Andrew's has influenced through this ministry! Not only spiritually but also financially, the school has been an important part of St. Andrew's ministry. Did you know we replaced the roofs of several buildings, purchased copy machines and telephones for the office, gave the funding for the sound system in Krysher Hall,

helped with paying for the construction of the marquee sign bearing the church name, and after we secured the VPK contract, we paid for new furniture, carpeting, and new computers in the office, just to name a few? When it seemed we were outgrowing our space in Friendship Hall in the late 90s, we had a bank account of over \$23,000 that we were saving to renovate Rubino Hall (the current Thrift Shop). The decision was made instead to give the building to the Thrift Shop. If we had more space, we could continue to grow. Friendship Hall does not afford us that privilege.

Unfortunately once the state got involved with preschool education by private providers (like our school), we have no longer been a money-making ministry – BUT we have always remained a ministry that proclaims Jesus to our community.

Please take the time to come visit us and encourage our ministry! Please keep the school and the Vestry in your prayers, as the decision will be made in March whether or not we can remain open to continue to serve our community.

CHRISTIAN FORMATION & EDUCATION *is a life-long process and is offered in the Anglican tradition of seeking the truth from diverse viewpoints, even as our relationship with God through Jesus never wavers. Different viewpoints may be represented at different times.*

Employment: Counselors Needed for DaySpring Summer Camp
