FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

It has now been one year since Diane and I have become part of St. Andrew's. We are so blessed to be part of St. Andrew's and to be involved with what God is doing in our midst. We are growing in Christian faith. We are growing numerically and financially. We are reaching out to our community and helping those in need by feeding them, clothing them, and visiting them.

Last year I was asked what I would do to help make St. Andrew's grow. I replied that I would try to do three things in particular. First, I would try to visit all our members. I have made a good start on that. I have visited over 180 of our parishioners. As a result, I know many of you much better than I would otherwise. I know many of your needs and personal concerns and am able to pray for you with direction in my prayers.

Secondly I wanted to start up Adult Bible study classes and Adult formation classes. In order for us to grow numerically, we need to grow spiritually. We need to have depth in our spiritual lives. That depth is found by really knowing God in a personal and experiential way. Who God really is, is the God that is revealed in the Bible through Jesus. Sometimes people think they know God, but they do not bother with knowing God's Word the Bible. As a result the God they think they know is really a god of their own imagining. And then when hard times come they are disappointed because the god of their imaging cannot really help. So we are learning the Scriptures and getting to

know God. But also in our Adult formation classes we are studying who we are as Episcopalians. We have studied our beliefs, our liturgy, our prayers, and our history. It is important to know why we do what we do and why we believe what we believe. Knowing these things helps to worship more fully and intelligently.

And thirdly I wanted us to try to put the divisions that have torn our church behind us. I think as we have been focusing on what is ahead for us, focusing on the needs of others, and focusing on the Scriptures and our Book of Common Prayer that we have become more unified and excited about what God is doing in our church. We have seen God working in us, through us, and around us.

So this coming year, let us keep growing! Warmly in Christ,

Good Things Do Happen

As you get older, the years seem to fly by. You retire, and never know what day it is until you turn on the TV. You look for new things to do, like spending more time around the house or garden, doing arts and crafts, or getting involved with new adventures. For me, it's working in the garage making and creating things.

One day while working with Tom Beem (our "C.E.O. of Maintenance"), we talked about the Sacristy light. After hanging so long over the altar, it had started to deteriorate on the inside, chipping away and dropping ashes on the Credence Table and white linens.

An idea came to me! Could I build a new lamp worthy of hanging above the altar? Was I good enough? Could I possibly design a lamp to blend and flow with the beautiful contemporary, simplistic wood look of our church?

Not telling anyone, in July 2013 I began laying out designs and taking pictures of our altar and the existing lamps hanging throughout the Sanctuary. This would be a real challenge, and something I really wanted to do for the love of my church.

August. Once I was satisfied with the plans, I made a list of items I needed:

1. *Top grade Red Oak*, for its hardness and longevity. I found it at an old lumber yard for boats in Homosassa. Cutting and finishing took most of my time, especially making the holding bar for the lamp.

September. I finished the woodwork and made sure it all went together as planned.

2. The internal parts. These would be hard to find: they had to be specific to fit together and pass safety codes. I started to get frustrated, driving around for many days, having no luck. Driving down Mariner Boulevard late one stormy day I saw a sign, "The Lighting

Gallery." "O.K.," I thought as I pulled into the parking lot, "One last stop." The rain was so hard I had to run to the door. A man standing inside opened the door and said, "I was just about to close." I apologized and asked if he could give me a few minutes of his time. "Sure, come on in! I'm David," he said.

I introduced myself, showed him my plans and asked for ideas and parts to make it work. David took my sketches and invited me to walk through the show room while he went through the swinging doors into his warehouse. Forty-five minutes later, the doors swung open again and David came out with a large box. When he put it on the counter, I could not believe my eyes! It was full of all sorts of brass parts: threaded pipe, washers, nuts, hanging hooks, and much more. David explained to me how to improvise and complete my lamp, saying, "Use what you need, and call me if I can help you with anything else." Pulling my wallet out I asked, "How much?" He said, "If it's for the love of God, there is no cost and no wasted time." I could not thank David enough!

That night while lying in bed, I remembered what David had said to me. I knew then that God was helping me, and guiding my hands: "After all, Jesus was a carpenter."

I continued working on my project, finding the perfect globe, flickering candle bulbs, chain and glass to complete the lamp.

The evening the light was hung up in my garage, I called Gail out to see it, and turned it on. We just stood there staring into the flame. Gail squeezed my hand and said, "You did a good job! I'm proud."

Now we had to convince Fr. Lance, the Junior Warden and the Vestry. After two weeks, Fr. Lance called me and said, "Let's go with it, it's been approved." I did my final sanding, staining and waxing.



With the help of Deacon Wallner, Rick Pederson, Pete Jackson and Tom Beem, the lamp was installed the week before Bishop Smith came to officiate at the introduction of Fr. Lance as our new priest. The timing couldn't have been any better. Sitting in the pew, I was blessed and honored.

What has this done for me? It has made me a better person, knowing that I have contributed something I made that will hang about the altar of God in the church that I love, sharing it with the people I enjoy being with. What more can I ask?

Thank you Jesus and thank you St. Andrew's for sharing our light for all.
