FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

The holiest and highest feast day of the Christian year is quickly approaching. The church can go without celebrating the birth of Jesus at Christmas; the church can go without celebrating the Wise Men worshipping Jesus as God in human form at Epiphany. The church can go without celebrating the Holy Spirit falling on the believers at Pentecost; the church can go without celebrating actually any holy day except one; it cannot go without Easter.

Easter is the foundation day of our faith and lays the foundation for the church. As the Apostle Paul once wrote, "If Christ has not been raised from the dead then our faith is in vain." In other words, if Jesus did not rise from the dead Easter morning, then all that we do and all that we believe is futile. If Jesus did not rise from the dead, then our hope for any life after we die is foolish. If Jesus did not rise from the dead, then trying to be good and denying ourselves any pleasures during our lifetime is short-sighted. If this life is all there is, then we should have the life philosophy of, "Let's eat, drink, and be merry; for tomorrow we die."

But the fact is, that Jesus WAS RAISED from the dead. It is not a myth. It is not simply wishful thinking. It is not because we like Hollywood endings to our stories. God did raise Jesus from the dead. And when he raised Jesus from the dead he validated everything Jesus ever said and did. In fact, as Dr. Wilbur Morehead Smith once wrote, "we know more about the details of the hours immediately before and the actual death of Jesus, in and near Jerusalem, than we know about the death of any other one man in all the ancient world." We have eye witnesses to the fact of his resurrection.

And that is the point of Easter, isn't it? Jesus rose from the dead; and because he rose, now we know and believe that all he said and promised is true. Because he rose from

the dead, our sins can indeed be forgiven. Because he rose from the dead, we can be reborn spiritually, have new life in God, and know God's great love for us. Because he rose from the dead, we can be reconciled with God and are able to have his Holy Spirit live within us. Because he rose from the dead, we know that those who have died before us who had faith in Christ are now with Jesus where he is in heaven. Because he rose from the dead, we know that we too, who believe in Jesus, will have life even after our bodies stop living; and we will be given new resurrection bodies.

I have not mentioned all of the benefits of the resurrection, but you get the point. The highest and holiest day of the year is quickly approaching. It should be with great joy and awe that we celebrate the fact of our Lord Jesus' death and resurrection. Very soon we will all say together, "The Lord is risen!" "The Lord is risen indeed."

I hope you will make plans to participate in as many services as you are able during Holy Week. We will have Rite I services on Monday at noon and 6 PM. On Wednesday we will have our 10 AM service which includes prayers for healing. On Maundy Thursday we will have a soup supper at 6 PM followed at 7 PM with a foot washing service and the stripping of the altar. We will observe on Good Friday the liturgy of the day followed by the Stations of the Cross. There is the Memorial Garden service followed by the flowering of the Cross on Holy Saturday. And then we will have glorious Easter morning services at 8 AM and 10:30 AM. I am smiling in joyful anticipation as I write these words. Looking forward to wishing you a wonderful Easter,

As a member of The Order of St. Luke, Mary attended missions throughout the south, always returning with new ideas to incorporate into our healing missions. She also reintroduced *New Beginnings* and *Happenings* to the kids in our church.


