## FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

May is probably one of the most beautiful months of the year. Spring has sprung and the flowers are blooming, the breezes are delightful, and the sun is warm; it is not quite as hot as it will be in the summer, but it is just warm and pleasant. Spring is full of promise and new life. And coincidentally enough, that is what Easter season is all about, it is all about promise and new life.

The promise of springtime in the world relates to the new growth and the potential harvest that growth may potentially bring. The new life is the life that is springing up around us in the plants and birds, and other creatures.

Easter season also relates to promise and new life. In Easter the potential does not have anything to do material gain, unlike spring's promise of large harvests. In Easter our potential harvest is a spiritual harvest based on the power of the resurrection of Jesus. Because we are told in the Scriptures that resurrection power is the same power working in us! The power that brought Jesus from death to life is what is strengthening us to change and become more like Jesus. That power is there to help us grow into better servants of the Lord and better servants to each other. So the promise of Easter season has to do with changed lives, changed attitudes, even and perhaps particularly changed life directions.

Easter season has also to do with new life. Just as Jesus returned from death to life, we also move from death to life. The Apostle Paul tells us in his letter to the Ephesians that we were dead in trespasses and sins but we were made alive together with Christ, raised up with him and seated with him in heavenly places. All through the New Testament we are told about this new life. Jesus talks about it in terms of being "born again" to Nicodemus. Peter talks about it in terms

of precious metal being purified in his first letter, in his second letter he talks about it in terms of escaping slavery. John talks about it in terms of coming into the light from out of darkness. Paul talks about it in terms of a tree, in terms of a body, and in terms of a building.

So it is really kind of exciting, isn't it? As we look around us and see the plants growing new sprouts and as we see eggs appearing in nests, and the little ducklings following their mommas, we know that we can expect God to be bringing His life to grow in us. We can ask for his strength to change bad habits and overcome hard times and know that His resurrection power will be given to us to help us. Whatever picture of new life may apply to us—the being born again, the precious metal being purified, the escaping from slavery, the coming into the light out of darkness, the growing and sprouting leaves or being rooted as a tree, the growing up from a child's body to an adult, or finally the being part of a building that is being put together—reflect on that picture and apply it to yourself and your life this month and grow! Sprout! Show the signs of new life in your life.

Pray that God would continue to strengthen and grow not only your life, but continue to pray also that He will continue to strengthen and grow us as a church here at St. Andrew's!
