

FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

October is here! Cooler weather—well, weather more in the 80's than the 90's—is here. And we have a number of things to look forward to as well. On Sunday, **October 5th** we will be commemorating **St. Francis Day** with our traditional blessing of the animals. This event will take place on the patio outside Krysher Hall at 4 PM.

Later that week the Thrift Shop has its **annual furniture sale** on Friday and Saturday, **October 10th and 11th**. Two weeks later we have our **Fall work day** on **October 25th**. Then on **October 29th** we'll end the month with our second annual **Trunk or Treat** in the church parking lot.

And these events take place amid our usual Saturday, Sunday and Wednesday services, our Wednesday youth nights, our Adult Formation Classes and Adult Bible Study, choir practice, back-pack ministry, altar guild work, the day-to-day thrift shop hours, and so on. We really are a busy parish!

And what is the point of all this activity? Is it so that we have a place for gathering socially for fun and friendship? Is it so we can try to help those in Spring Hill who are in need? Is it so we can help people learn about their faith and grow in their knowledge of God and his holy word? Is it so we can worship together? Yes, yes it is for all those reasons. We are not simply here so we can gather socially; Spring Hill does not need another club or group like the Elks or Rotary Club. We do try to help people in need but we are not simply a Salvation Army or Goodwill either. We spend lots of time training and teaching our youth and our adult members more about our faith and about Jesus, but we are not simply a Bible school or seminary. And yes we worship God through Jesus our Lord, but again, there is more to it than worship.

We are St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, followers and disciples of Jesus Christ, and as such we are part of the body of Jesus Christ here in Spring Hill. Jesus lived in ancient Israel some 2,000 years ago; we are trying to model our lives after his life. During his life, Jesus spent time simply hanging out with his disciples talking and laughing with them, and so we make time to spend together. Jesus spent much time helping people who needed help. And also here we have any number of ministries geared to helping others in our community. Jesus continuously taught his followers about who God is, what God wanted them to know, and how to live. Again, we also teach what Jesus taught and what the disciples taught so we can learn who God is and what He expects from us. And because of all this, we worship God because of who He is and for the love and care he shows us.

All of this is what the Church of Jesus Christ does. And I am very happy to say we do this at St. Andrew's. Take part in all that you are able because you are a follower of our Lord Jesus! See you in church!

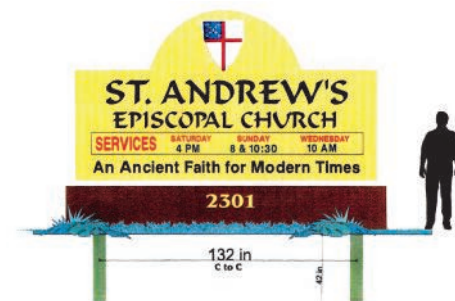
The Tool Kit

MUSIC NOTES

Jody Bowes, Minister of Music

In September we had a couple of meetings to begin the prayerful process of possibly adding a **Contemporary Service** to our schedule next year.

While the beautiful words and melodies of modern praise music are often incorporated into our Sunday Offertory or Communion music, having a dedicated Contemporary service will allow us to focus in depth on this style of praise music, which is loved and appreciated by Christians of all ages.

I would like to reprint an excerpt from Fr. Lance's Weekend Email of Sept. 12. He was writing about the meeting that was coming up on Sept. 14:

"I have been asked by a number of people, 'What IS a contemporary service and how does that differ from what we now do?' That is a good question! The main difference in an Episcopal contemporary service and a traditional service is the music. In our 10:30 service we use mostly hymns with choruses every so often. Contemporary music is music that has been composed and performed within the last several years. Why is this important? One of the main ways people worship God is through music. I believe, we need to be sensitive to the type of music others like and try to provide it if possible so all feel comfortable worshipping here. Because we are Episcopal we will still follow the Rite 2 service. All that said, we are still simply considering everything. If you are interested in discussing the feasibility of this sort of service, please come and bring your opinions."

We decided at the Sept. 14 meeting to continue meeting about twice monthly to discuss all the logistics of effectively supporting a Contemporary service. If you
