

FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

November is a month from the first to the last known for giving thanks. On November 3rd, we observe the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed, also known as All Souls' Day. It is on this day we make a point of remembering those who have passed into the nearer presence of the Lord. And although we simply say their names in the service, it is a time for us to remember and be thankful for their lives. Typically we remember things about their lives when we have funeral services, but it is over the days, weeks, months and even the years that pass that things come to mind about those dearly departed. Those memories may make us smile, even laugh, or they may tug at our hearts. On All Souls' Day we gather those memories up again and thank God for letting us have the time with our departed loved ones that we did.

And then there is the grand Thanksgiving Day itself towards the end of the month. I suspect that for many of us, Thanksgiving Day is a holiday of some stress. A big meal is usually prepared. For some of us company may be coming or at least family is there. For others perhaps there is no one there at home anymore, in which case a different type of stress is possible. In either situation though, Thanksgiving Day should be understood as a gift for us. It is a day that we have been given to be thankful to God for his blessings to us. Do you know that in the Bible one of the main faults God found with his

people the Israelites was that they were not thankful? We are told over and over again to be thankful both in the Old Testament and in the New Testament. Is this command given to us because somehow God needs our thanks?

No, God wants us to have thankful hearts, which are the primary source for joy. Do you want to be happy? Well, yeah—everyone does, right? If you and I want to have joy and happiness, then we need to learn to be thankful. And look, we have a whole day set aside for that very purpose!

This month, the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed service is on November 3rd at 11 AM in the Memorial Garden. If you have a name you want read aloud, please make certain that you write the name on the list in the Narthex or that you call Trish, the church secretary, at 352-683-2010. We will also have a Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day at 10 AM. If you are able to come a bit early you will have a perfect place and opportunity to be able to quietly give thanks to God for his blessings to you this past year.

God is so good to us; he is good to us because he loves us. In Ephesians chapter 3 St. Paul prays that we would have the strength to be able to comprehend the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge. My prayer for all of us this November is that we will learn to be more and more thankful to our loving Heavenly Father.

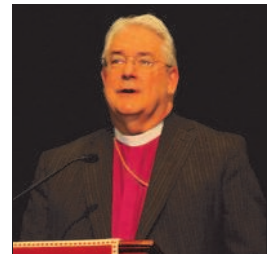

ommended that a parish review/revise by-laws upon installing a new rector or every 5-7 years, whichever comes first.

- **Anti-racism** presented many areas in today's world where racism is evident. The attendees of this workshop expanded some of the ideas to a broader sense, i.e., stereotyping people. Although your delegates did not feel this is an issue at St Andrew's, it is good to be aware.
- **Safeguarding God's Children** training has been streamlined to be completed in less than 4 hours. It has been enhanced to include how to identify possible abusers and the methods they use to find their victims. It still includes the pitfalls of child and elder abuse and how to insure we recognize these.
- The **web workshop** was very informative, encouraging us to switch our parish website from *Digital Faith* to *Word Press*. We are looking into making this move.
- **Healthy Churches Creating Healthy People** - In every way we should assist in helping each other make healthy choices – not just on Sundays, but throughout the week. This should be especially important for young people and teens who need adult guidance in order to stay out of trouble, and not bow to peer pressure.
- **Healing Ministry Restoring Joy** - In an aging congregation there is hardly

ever a smiling face. It seems as if the joy of worship is missing; however due to advanced age and pain it is hardly expected to see much cheer. We have to overcome this weariness and burnt out feeling among us. In the Church every one should be overflowing with Joy, to restore healing in our lives. A demonstration was given to show the call of the church to the call of duty: We are like empty bottles doing nothing. Add a little water, it just sits there. Add a little Joy detergent, the Joy water begins to flow open the bottle and our JOY OVERFLOWS. As Christians, this is what our lives are supposed to be. *"The Joy of the Lord is our strength." John 15: 11*

- **Anti Racism issues** –The war on Racism continues. Some sections of society think they are singled out more than others for discrimination. Young inner-city teens and youths in general feel trapped in never-ending poverty and crime. What can the Church do? We as the body of the Church should unite together and address these issues. We need the Church to stand up for what is right and what is wrong. Too often we hear the Church isn't doing anything.

Convention business: As always the Bishop's address was enlightening. He reviewed his goals from the 2013 convention and brought us up to date on his progress. This will be covered in more detail in the upcoming *Southern Cross* magazine.

The only resolution to be voted upon was to bring Canon XIX into compliance with Article V, Section 5 of the Constitution of the Diocese. Basically it was electing people to serve in an organization within the Diocese. The canon references serving on the board of Bishop Gray Inn while the constitution article references serving as trustees of the University of the South. Resolution to bring our canons into compliance with constitution passed.

Budget was passed. The asking from Diocese will be 10% of our 2013 operating budget (\$31,411) and Capital asking will be 10% of our 2013 capital budget (\$375). You will see these figures in our 2015 budget.

Fr Lance was elected to the **Standing Committee**. This is a council that advises the bishop. In certain circumstances, the Standing Committee is the ecclesiastical authority of the Diocese of Southwestern Florida in the absence of the bishop. The Standing Committee is involved in a number of matters including church indebtedness and ordination. Standing Committee members serve three-year terms, and may not serve more than two consecutive terms. An election to fill an unexpired term is counted as a full term.
