# FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,

It seems as though there are three New Year times during each year. We have our Christian New Year at the beginning of Advent. Then there is the world's New Year on January first. And then, well, then we have the New Year for our church here at St. Andrew's. We have our annual parish meeting and elect a group of men and women to our vestry who serve and offer direction for the church. We just had our annual meeting and we are gearing up for our new St. Andrew's year. Our new vestry is composed of the following women and men: Harry Calderbank, John Crouse, Craig Gates, Loa Jackson, Ester Marion, Rick Pederson, Michelle Traudt, Carolyn Wallner, and Rita Watson-Trapp. (John Follansbee has asked to step down from the vestry because of his responsibilities as Church Treasurer. Rita as our first alternate was asked to join the new vestry and she accepted.) It is a great vestry and I am looking forward to working with them. Please pray for us as we have our vestry retreat February 6th and 7th.

It has now been two years since Diane and I have become part of St. Andrew's. We are so blessed to be part of St. Andrew's and to be involved with what God is doing in our midst. We are growing in Christian faith. We are growing numerically and financially. We are reaching out to our community and helping those in need by feeding them, clothing them, and visiting them.

I told the vestry when I arrived that I want to visit everyone in the church. This past year I completed my goal of visiting members and regular attenders. However, I did not visit everyone. There were a number of people who I either could not contact or we had scheduling difficulties. Still I was

able to visit with over 250 of our congregation in their homes. As a result, I know many of you much better than I would otherwise. I know many of your needs and personal concerns and am able to pray for you with direction in my prayers. And I do pray for you all. I will start again with visits in February. If I did not visit with you, please sign up for a visit.

Two years ago I also wanted to start up Adult Bible study classes and Adult formation classes. In order for us to grow numerically, we need to be healthy spiritually as well and that requires growth. Our spiritual lives need to grow and continually develop more depth. That depth is found by really knowing God in a personal and experiential way. Who God really is, is the God who is revealed in the Bible through Jesus. Sometimes people think they know God, but they do not bother with knowing God's Word, the Bible. As a result the God they think they know is really a god of their own imagining. And then when hard times come they are disappointed because the god of their imaging cannot really help. So we are learning the Scriptures and getting to know God. But also in our Adult formation classes we are studying who we are as Episcopalians. We have studied our beliefs, our liturgy, our prayers, and our history. I am happy to tell you that we are growing in knowledge and understanding.

This year I hope the new narthex is completed. This will include the renovated bathrooms, the room for young moms and babies and a multi-purpose room. We also hope to put up some screens and projectors and learn to use them in our services. It will be a good year and it is an exciting time for our church as we continue to grow both in our numbers and in our spiritual depth as followers of Jesus!

#### I Sing a Song of the Saints of God:

This charming presentation of the beloved classic hymn by *Lesbia Scott* (1898-1987) draws children into the vivid world of saints and their life adventures. We see how saints have demonstrated qualities of courage, joy, love of Christ, kindness, patience, and generosity. It is beautifully illustrated.

While you're there we suggest you investigate the many books we have for **your** reading enjoyment as well, such as:

*The Study of Spirituality* by Cheslyn Jones and Geoffrey Wainwright .... about the patterns of Christian discipleship, praying and living, representing Anglican, Roman Catholic, Free Church and Orthodox traditions and devotions throughout the centuries; or

#### Wishful Thinking: A Theological ABC

by Frederick Buechner ... one thoughtprovoking quote from the book: "Of the Seven Deadly Sins, anger is possibly the most fun. To lick your wounds, to smack your lips over grievances long past... so savor to the last toothsome morsel both the pain you are given and the pain your are giving back... in many ways it is a feast fit for a king. The chief drawback is that what you are wolfing down is yourself. The skeleton at the feast is you."

# YOUTH MINISTRY



Registration begins at 9 am. A closing Eucharist will be celebrated by Bp. Smith. Registration packets will be mailed to each church at the end of January. ### Twinamaani in Sarasota For Absalom Jones Day

SARASOTA - In celebration of the Feast of Absalom Jones, the first African-American ordained as a priest in the Episcopal Church, the Church of the Redeemer in Sarasota has invited the Rev. Canon Benjamin Twinamaani, rector at Tampa's Grace Episcopal Church, to preach on Sun., Feb. 8 during the 7:30, 9 & 11 am. Masses, and on Sat., Feb. 7, during the evening Mass at 5:30 pm.

Born a slave in Delaware in 1746, Absalom Jones ultimately was able to buy his freedom in 1784, and pursue his calling. Each year during Black History Month, Redeemer commemorates Fr. Jones's religious and social action with this special Feast day of devotion.

An honorary canon of the Episcopal Diocese of Delaware, Fr. Twinamaani is a clergy member of the Fr. John E. Culmer Chapter of the Union of Black Episcopalians and a member of the National Nominations Committee. A native of Uganda, he was raised in that country's Anglican Province, which has a unique heritage of Christian witness.

Knowing no one in America, Fr. Twinamaani moved to the United States to attend college, eventually earning degrees from Bishop Tucker Theological College and the Dallas Theological Seminary. In his 24 years of ordained ministry, he has served as parish clergy under five archbishops and six bishops in four dioceses: Kampala, Uganda; Dallas, Texas; Delaware; and Southwest Florida. He joined Grace Episcopal Church in 2005.
