

FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,
 Holy Week is coming soon! We are looking forward to a wonderful week beginning with Palm Sunday, then followed by the *Triduum*: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday, and culminating with Easter Day.

On Maundy Thursday we will have our traditional soup supper first, so dust off your best soup recipes and bring a pot of soup to share. Afterwards we have the Maundy Thursday service with the foot washing and stripping of the altar. On Good Friday we will have the Stations of the Cross service. Holy Saturday we have the Memorial Garden service and then the flowering of the cross. Later, after dark on Saturday at 8:30 pm, we have our Easter Vigil service. If you have not ever been to the Easter Vigil service you may want to come. The service starts outside with a fire. From the fire the Paschal Candle is lit which then is taken into the dark church. As it slowly progresses down the aisle the candles held by the parishioners are lit and the church slowly lights up. The Scriptures highlighting God's plan of salvation for humanity are read and at the end, the priest proclaims, Alleluia Christ is risen, and people ring the bells they have brought and with great rejoicing we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus! It is a glorious time. We are celebrating this service on Saturday early evening rather than Sunday at 6 am this year. As many of you know the ancient Jews marked their days from sunset in the evening until sunset the next day. So the first day of the week (our Sunday) began at sunset on the Sabbath Day (our Saturday). Although we do not know the exact time of Jesus rising from the dead, we know that he was certainly gone by early morning

when the women came to the tomb. But he may have been gone for some time. It could be that he rose at 8:30 the night before; we only know that he rose from the dead earlier on the first day of the week. So therefore we are not amiss to celebrate our vigil at 8:30 pm.

So all that to say; I encourage you to attend our Easter Vigil service. But you are not limited to celebrating Easter to Saturday evening. We also have an 8 am service and our 10:30 am service as well. You are welcome to attend the Vigil and one of the other two services. All the services are filled with the joy of our resurrected Lord Jesus. We have our traditional Easter egg hunt at 9:30 am, and the youth dig up their buried *Alleluias* shortly after that.

Easter is the high point of the Christian year. As St. Paul has stated, if Christ is not risen then we are still in our sins. If Christ is not risen, our hope is in vain. If Christ is not risen, then we have no reason for any expectation of our life after we die.

But Christ IS risen and our sins are forgiven and our hope for our future and the future of those who have passed on before us is not in vain, Alleluia indeed!

Wishing you a most blessed and meaningful Easter Celebration this year!

HOLY WEEK

Dear Members & Friends of St. Andrew's,
Holy Week is upon us! This weekend is the Palm Sunday celebration, on Wednesday we have a special Rite I service at 10 am; on Maundy Thursday we have the washing of the feet ceremony, then the Good Friday service followed by the Stations of the Cross; and the Holy Saturday service in the memorial garden followed by the flowering of the cross. Then there is the Easter Vigil at 8:30 Saturday evening and Easter morning services Sunday morning.

I love all the services; each one is special and meaningful in its own way. If I had to choose one service that is, in my mind, more profound, it would have to be the **Maundy Thursday** service. Most scholars think the term 'Maundy' comes from the Latin 'mandatum' or mandate. This is from the Vulgate (Latin version) New Testament when Jesus says, "A new commandment I give to you..." in Latin it was "a new mandate." So we could call it *Mandate Thursday* or *Commandment Thursday*. On this night,

Jesus did several things we commemorate. The first is the Lord's Supper. And also that night he washed his disciples' feet. If you have never had your feet washed or if you have never washed someone else's feet, it is an intense experience. It is the experience of serving and being served in a very personal way within your personal space.

I hope you participate in all the services and let the Lord through his Word and Holy Spirit impact you in a mighty way!

I look forward to seeing you this weekend to celebrate the entry of our Lord into Jerusalem and then I hope to see you throughout the coming week!


Sunday School


Dear Friends,
