FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends,

As we move into October this year I confess I am thankful and excited. God has been so good to us here at St. Andrew's. There are a number of reasons to be thankful and excited.

First, our addition project is now in the permitting stage. So as soon as that is finished, the actual building will begin. Soon, very soon we will see a new narthex, new bathrooms, a new welcoming room for young parents and another room we can use for a classroom, a bride's room, and a family room for funerals. So this time next year, we will look back and have a hard time remembering how we got along without having this addition.

With that in mind, remember that this time last year I was simply talking about the possibility of putting up screens for our service. And now look! We have these screens up and our people like them. It was amazing how quickly people got used to having them up there. We started using them at the end of June. Then the first weekend of my vacation the computer failed so the service went without the screens throughout August. It is funny that when I came back from vacation people told me that they really missed having the service up on the screens. We now have a 'new' used computer that will power our projection pictures so hopefully we will be good to go for a long time. I like seeing people's faces during the service. In particular though I like that when new people come to church, there is no confusion about where we are in the service, which page we are on, which verse we are singing—people come in and know exactly where we are and feel comfortable and right at home! And for that to happen in an Episcopal service is really wonderful.

Some of you have been aware that the flat roof over the sacristy has been leaking but we now have a contractor who will replace the roof and the bad wood. We will have the old roof completely removed and then a gently sloped roof will be put up. We had the money already set aside for that repair.

October begins our Stewardship campaign. I am always excited to see the generosity of God's people. I am sure that this year will be no exception. Most of you have already received my letter concerning stewardship and with it your pledge card. I am hoping again this year to be able to put aside at least \$10,000 for Outreach and Missions. This is what we did last year. Scripture teaches us that God loves a cheerful giver. I hope that you will contemplate all the blessings of God and then be able to pledge your tithe joyfully.

It is a good time to be part of St. Andrew's! God's Spirit is moving among us and in us. Lives are being drawn closer to God and people are changing. As we move into October I am thankful and excited and I hope you are too!

DIOCESE NEWS

Rays Beat Sox at Baseball With the Bishop 2015

The 2015 *Baseball with the Bishop* attracted over 600 Episcopalians and friends from the Diocese of Southwest Florida to the Rays' Sept. 11 win over the Boston Red Sox. Bishop Dabney Smith pitched the ceremonial first pitch.

St. John the Divine of Sun City Center sold the most tickets, winning the right to lead the Seventh Inning Stretch of "Take Me Out to the Ball Game," which was featured on the Jumbotron.

The event is a fundraiser for Episcopal Charities of Southwest Florida.

Teacher Honored by Oceanography Magazine

ST. PETERSBURG — Jenna Cummings, Canterbury School of Florida's Director of Marine Studies, is currently featured in *ORIGIN* magazine's cover story of the nation's top 100 Ocean Heroes.

"I believe that our children can help us save our oceans," Cummings said in a

press release. "My students bring excitement, energy and creativity whenever we are in the lab or in the field. We need to utilize that to empower our community members to work together to restore and protect our local waterways."

Three years ago Cummings secured an international partnership with Cousteau Divers, making Canterbury the world's first Cousteau Divers partner school. Subsequently, the school's 2,800 sq. ft. Marine Studies-dedicated facility was re-named the *Cousteau Center for Marine Studies*.

All students at Canterbury, from Pre-kindergarten through grade 12, utilize this facility as part of their marine studies curriculum. They also participate in a wide range of marine-related community service each year thanks to Cummings' local and national partnerships with groups like NOAA, the Florida Wildlife Research Institute, Tampa Bay Watch, the College of Marine Science at USF, Eckerd College, and the U.S. Geological Survey.
