FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends and Members of St. Andrew's,

Summer is here at St. Andrew's—that means that half our year is already over. Wow, what a great year it has been so far. We are once again ready to go on our addition. Thank you to the ninety percent who voted to build the addition and who even pledged money to help make it a reality! And thank you to those who voted against it! As I tell people from time to time, “if two people agree about everything, one of them isn't needed!” Having the ‘no’ votes keeps everyone on their toes, it encourages us to double check what we say and think. I hear from few of you that there is some trepidation about how this addition will affect the lighting in our church; if it will look good from the road, and whether the new landscaping and fountain will look as nice as what we now have. This reminds me of the story of how many Episcopalians it takes to change a light bulb. It takes 3—one to actually change the bulb and two to talk about how great the old bulb was. I suppose this attitude fits well with how we do church. We like the old and in fact we have kept the old prayers and we have modeled our service on the liturgies from the ancient church all the way back to the apostolic fathers. So not wanting or needing change can be a very good thing; nonetheless, physical things do wear out and as we know there are areas that are wearing out that need to be renovated, like our bathrooms and walkways. Adding a room for babies and young children will help our church become more Young Family friendly. Of course, having a family-friendly facility is only one part of the equation. We ourselves also need to continue to be friendly and welcoming. One of the things I often hear from our visitors is how welcoming we are and that is a wonderful reflection on our congregation.

Another change coming up is the addition of screens and projectors. Within the month of June I hope to have the projectors and screens in use during our services. I will need people within each service to sit by the computer to keep the screens up to date with where we are in the service. What this means is simply pushing the arrow key. It is not difficult but it is important to stay alert so people are always seeing the correct words on the screens. If you would be willing to do this once or twice a month in the service you attend, please let me know. Having these in place will allow us to be more flexible in our service as well. Instead of being tied to what is written on our laminated forms we can change our Prayers of the People and other optional areas.

During the summer I am hoping that we are able to reach out more to the people in our community. Typically our attendance drops a bit during the summer. I am hoping that we can begin to change this trend! This summer I plan to spend more time visiting members and visitors. If you would like a visit, please let me know or call the church office and talk to Trish to set up an appointment.

Mission and Outreach Report

At the beginning of this year Fr. Lance requested volunteers from the congregation to form a **Mission and Outreach Committee**. This committee would be tasked to wisely allocate the \$10,000 the church had set aside for outreach and missions from 2014. Under the leadership of **Peg Davis**, our Deacon-in-Training, the following people agreed to be part of the committee: **Maureen Follansbee, Sherry Haun, Eddie Lindsey, Norman Neill, and Hal Smith**. Fr. Lance had requested that monies be divided into local, regional, and then global outreach.

After significant discussion the committee decided to allocate the \$10,000 as follows: 75% to stay locally, 15% to stay regionally, and 10% to go global. After research and discussion a consensus of the committee recommended the following ministries and agencies receive as follows: Local Hispanic ministries \$2,900; *People Helping People* \$2928.75; *Closet of Hope* \$532.50 and *Jericho*

Road Ministries \$532.50. Under Regional, *Feed the Children* will receive \$1,065 and under global, *Heifer International* will receive \$710.

The committee needs to be thanked for their hard work. They spent many hours researching different local, regional, and global ministries most of whom were worthy; after the research they had to spend time discussing their findings and come to a consensus of which groups could be helped. So thank you, Maureen, Sherry, Eddie, Norman, and Hal!!

And thank you, Church of St. Andrew’s! Because of your generosity we have this fund from which we can help and support God’s work in our church, in our community and throughout the world!

Bishop Dabney Smith Nominated for Presiding Bishop

PARRISH – The Rt. Rev. Dabney T. Smith, Bishop of the Diocese of Southwest Florida, is one of four candidates to lead The Episcopal Church as its Presiding Bishop. The election will be held this summer at the church's 78th General Convention, which will be held in Salt Lake City.

In a letter to the Diocese, Bishop Smith said he was "deeply honored to be on this list of candidates," adding, "We are a healthy diocese with great claims upon us for the bold, compelling witness of the Gospel. If I am elected Presiding Bishop, the exciting work here will continue," said Smith. "If I remain the fifth bishop of this fine diocese, the exciting work here will continue."

Bishop Smith is one of four nominees put forward by the Joint Nominating Committee

for the Election of the Presiding Bishop. The list also includes The Rt. Rev. Michael Curry of the Diocese of North Carolina, The Rt. Rev. Ian Douglas of the Diocese of Connecticut, and The Rt. Rev. Tom Breidenthal of the Diocese of Southern Ohio. To compile the initial slate, the committee culled through a list of 165 nominations representing over 60 dioceses. Video conferencing and face-to-face interviews afforded the opportunity for commission to get to know the candidates.

The nominating committee is composed of a lay member, a priest or deacon, and a bishop elected from each of the nine provinces of the Episcopal Church, plus two youth representatives who were appointed by the President of the House of Deputies.

The 78th General Convention is June 25 – July 3 in Salt Lake City. General Convention is held every three years, and is the bicameral governing body of the Church. It comprises the House of Bishops, with upwards of 200 active and retired bishops, and the House of Deputies, with more than 800 clergy and lay deputies elected from the 108 dioceses and three regional areas of the Church.

The Rt. Rev. Dabney Tyler Smith was elected bishop coadjutor of the Diocese of SW Florida in 2006. He was rector of Trinity Church, New Orleans and served at Holy Trinity in Melbourne, FL; St. Michael and All Angels in South Bend, IN; and Grace Church in Port Orange, FL.

The Diocese of Southwest Florida represents 77 Episcopal congregations and 14 parochial schools from Marco Island north to Brooksville. Part of The Episcopal Church and the worldwide Anglican Communion, the Diocese includes some of the earliest churches in Southwest Florida.

If elected, the Rt. Rev. Smith would be the 27th Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church, which was founded in 1789.

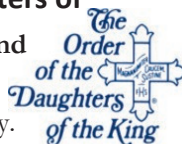

The Thurible

The term *Thurible* is not familiar to most of us. Yet, we have one situated at the altar.

A Thurible is a metal pot on a chain, with a removable lid and air holes, in which incense is burned. The

chain allows the pot to be swung gently, releasing smoke from the burning incense.

In many churches the Thurible is carried in processions and is used to cense the Gospel book before reading of the Gospel and the altar at the Offertory as part of the preparation for celebrating the Eucharist.

Incense is aromatic gum which is burned in a Thurible. Incense has been burned as part of Jewish and Christian worship since the beginning.

The burning of incense as part of the worship of God can be found in many examples of Holy Scripture as commanded by God:

Chronicle 13:11 "Every morning and evening they present burnt offerings and fragrant incense to the Lord."

Exodus 30:7-9 "Aaron must burn fragrant incense every morning when he tends the lamps. He must burn incense again when he lights the lamps at twilight so incense will burn regularly before the Lord."

Luke 1:8-10 "Once when Zechariah's division was on duty and he was serving as priest before God, he was chosen by lot, according to the custom of the priesthood to go into the temple of the Lord and burn incense. And when the time for the burning of incense came, all the assembled worshipers were outside praying."

Revelation 8:3-4 "Another angel, who had a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense to offer, with the prayers of all the saints, on the golden altar before the throne. The smoke of the incense together with the prayers of the saints went up before God from the angel's hand".

Many Episcopal churches use incense at every worship service, while others may use it only on Sunday. Some churches will only use incense on the special High Holy Feasts of the church year. Some churches use incense to enhance worship on certain Sundays, such as the first Sunday of every month.

Introducing our Pastor for August

Pastor Sharon is an ordained pastor in the Episcopal Church, Diocese of SW FL, member of the Anglican Communion. This ministry was birthed from Pastor Sharon's own personal

need and desire for Christ's Healing and Restoration. Dr. Lewis leads this ministry full time, bringing healing conferences to churches nationally and internationally, providing healing and training in healing. Thousands over the years have attended these conferences: "I am privileged to witness Jesus restoring broken marriages and healing broken people for His glory in the United States, British Columbia, Rwanda, Uganda, Bolivia, Peru, and the Dominican Republic."

"In order to carry the gospel of Jesus Christ to the world, His Church must be healed and restored. We know that wounded people wound others, but healed people through Jesus Christ heal people. That is the Good News we bring as Christ's wounded healers to the world. The healing and reconciliation of Jesus Christ is the hope of the world."

Pastor Sharon's son Brian, daughter-in-law Kristy, and granddaughter Zoe live outside of Baltimore, MD. They are all a joy and a gift from God in her life! And Benny, the part Retriever/Lab joy-dog, lives with her in Nokomis, FL.

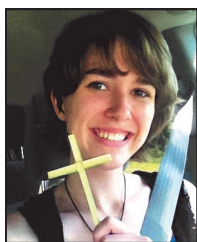


CONGRATULATIONS, GOOD LUCK & MANY BLESSINGS to our Graduating Seniors:
