FROM THE RECTOR

Dear Friends.

This year is one of those years that begins at a jog and moves into a run almost right away. We had an early Ash Wednesday and on March 20th it will be Palm Sunday and then Easter.

So really we are already half way through our Lenten Season. Things are going well here at St. Andrew's. One of the things we are trying is a new approach to our Scripture reading. We are having our readers rise and come to the front from the congregation. As you know we as Episcopalians are liturgical. Liturgical is an ancient word which means the work or worship of the people. When we worship, we do not simply watch some fellow up front do and say stuff, no, we have a participation in the worship service. It is like a dance where both partners have to do their part in order for it to work well. Thus we have the priest say something and the congregation responds. It is a back and forth with both sides doing their parts in the worship of God. It doesn't work when only one side is doing a part any more than a waltz would work with only one person doing the steps. Being liturgical is in our Episcopal DNA. The people in the congregation are not only vital in worship, they are integral in service as well. As it has been pointed out again and again, the people in our church at St. Andrew's serve. I have never been part of a church where so many are busy serving in one way or another. It is truly wonderful! And that of course is another positive aspect to having readers in the church worship service; it offers another way for people to serve. If you have already volunteered to read, thank you! If you have not but would be interested, please let me know. At this point in the 10:30 service we have enough volunteers so people will read once every two months. In the 8 am service we have readers for once a month and

in our Saturday service the rotation is about every month and a half.

Our new addition is coming along very well! The roof is up now so there will be no more flooding in front of the front doors. (Yea!) They are putting in the electricity and plumbing this week. So the building seems to be going up quickly. Perhaps by mid-April we can have our dedication. Hopefully you are as excited as I am to see the progress of the addition.

This past month we had another wedding! This one was unique to my experience because it was a bi-lingual service. Fr. Livan (from St. Francis in Tampa) said the Spanish parts and I said the English parts. Hector Manual Chamorro and Carmen Jeanette Ortiz were married and Fr. Livan and I officiated. We had over one hundred in attendance and it was a very joyful occasion! I am hoping that one day we will have that many and more attending our Spanish service on a regular basis.

In the vestry retreat we discussed having a congregational event (other than worship services) once a month. So we are hoping to do some more social events that will help us to get to know each other better and to have more fun together.

God has been so good to us here at St. Andrew's. I hope you are growing closer to Christ in your daily walk with him.

PLAINCHANT PRIMER

Endings are designated by number, i.e., for a psalm using "Tone III" and "Ending 2" the music would say "Tone III.2."

For plainchant, the **words** to the psalms are formatted using plain, bold and italic letters to indicate when to **change to the next note** in the Tone (**Bold**), and when you are to sing *two notes* on a *single word (italics)*.

If you look at the **music** for plainchant, you can see how the Tones are broken-up to allow the words to flow with the melody:


The melody line is divided into two sections (musical 'measures') by a vertical line. The first section is sung before the asterisk (*), the second half is the 'ending.'

The "Intonation" is sung at the very beginning (first verse only) as an "introduction" to the Psalm Tone. The curved line over the second and third notes (and in the middle of the ending) indicates when *one word* is to be sung under the *two connected notes*.

The symbol is a "Reciting Note" – many words are chanted using the same note. The "Mediation" is the conclusion of the first half of the verse (before the *). Some notes are in parenthesis (•) because sometimes they are not needed, depending on how many words are in each line.

The vertical lines under some notes tell us

when to change to this note when you see a **bold** word, you change to the next note that has a line under



This Lent we returned to our ancient musical roots by "singing" the psalm at the 10:30 am service. We are singing "Plainchant" style: all singers sing the same notes in unison. We are using a "Responsorial" format in which a Cantor (me) sings the first half of each verse, pausing at the asterisk (*); the congregation responds with the second half of the verse.

Where do we get the melodies for these chants? The Anglican church uses a set of tones, some with different "endings." The "ending" is the second half of the chant (the part after the *). The chant tones have very inventive names: "Tone I" through "Tone VIII" plus one called "The Peregrin Tone."

it. The "Termination" is the "Ending" part of the melody.

I hope you're enjoying singing (chanting) the psalms. As always, I appreciate your participation and feedback.

I'd also like to report that I had a wonderful time at **Hector & Carmen's wedding** on Feb. 6. The service was beautiful and I was very happy with the English and Spanish music selections that Olgamarie, Pedro and myself were able to offer. 

To all of you who sponsored St. Andrew's **Samantha Traudt** to state weightlifting championships on Feb. 5th, THANK YOU! Sami finished in **first place** in her class, and established new personal bests across the board. It was also one of the most significant dates in Nature Coast Technical High's athletic history. The *Lady Sharks* returned home with two individual state champions, two more state medalists, and finished as the state runners-up.

Coach Sharon Elliott stated, "It was a surprise. I really didn't expect it. Only four girls medaled but they all did great. It's awesome." Nature Coast finished with 20 team points behind River Ridge's 27.
