Church Carpet Colors

From Fr. Lance+

Diane and I had an opportunity this summer to visit Barcelona, Spain. While we were there we visited two churches. The first one we saw was the cathedral. It was an old magnificent gothic structure. Inside it was somewhat dark because the stained glass windows didn't let much light in and the candles and chandeliers struggled to brighten it up. We also visited a cathedral that is still in progress of being built called the Sagrada Familia or the Holy Family. This is one that was designed by an architect named Antonin Gaudi. He lived and worked in the late 1800s through the early 1900s. Gaudi loved to copy the lines of nature and use curves and natural light; his work would be classified as Art Nouveau. Around this same time in America, Frank Lloyd Wright became famous as an architect as well. His work is known as modern but like Gaudi he was inspired by nature and he loved to include a lot of natural light into his buildings. Both men built beautiful buildings and inspired and influenced many architects up through our present time. The reason I bring up this little history lesson is because our church is built in the tradition of Frank Lloyd Wright. It is modern and brings in light and is inspired by nature in some of the same ways that the Sagrada Familia is. The Sagrada Familia is magnificent and so is the gothic cathedral that is in Barcelona. But they are different and are beautiful in their own traditions.

This is important because we are planning to put down carpet and replace the pew seats in the church. There has been discussion on what color the carpet and the pew seats should be. Fortunately we have in place a design committee (Maureen Follansbee, Cheryl Pederson, and Diane Wallace) that has already done

a wonderful job on our new narthex. They have chosen great colors for the church. But I wanted to give everyone the logic behind their choices as well. Because our church is modern and is attempting to blend nature and light into our building the colors the church originally chose are the ones the design committee has also chosen. The church's original floor was the river rock that is still visible around the red carpet. You will note that it is obviously the colors of nature because it is directly from nature. Unfortunately a hard surface like that rock makes any noise, in a large room like we have, very loud. In order to somewhat muffle the noise red carpet was put down. Now the red is a beautiful color and red carpet is a traditional color for Episcopal churches to have. But we do not have a traditional church building. We have a modern church building. To put red carpet down on the floors is like a ballerina putting on high heels or a ball room dancer putting on ballet shoes. The shoes themselves are fine but they fit a particular style and costume of the dancer. In the same way our modern building goes with the natural colors like the river rock colors. And the red carpeting fits appropriately in traditional buildings like many of our traditional Episcopal churches. Because of that the design committee has chosen the carpet color that is in the narthex new addition and a mocha brown for the pew seat color.

Carpet color choosing is always a tricky sort of thing to do in a church. No matter what is chosen, there may be those who would prefer something else. And that will probably be the case for us as well. But I wanted us to understand the reason behind the choices of our design committee. It follows the lead of our original church colors and it is fitting and appropriate for the architecture of our church building.

From the Rector

Dear Friends,

October is here! Cooler weather is here. And we have a number of things to look forward to as well. On Sunday October 2nd we will be commemorating St. Francis Day with our traditional blessing of the animals. This event will take place on the patio outside Krysher Hall at 3 pm.

Is it so we can help people learn about their faith and grow in their knowledge of God and his holy word? Is it so we can worship together? Yes, it is for all those reasons. We are not simply here so we can gather socially; Spring Hill does not need another club or group like the Elks or Rotary Club. We do try to help people in need but we are not simply a Salvation Army or Goodwill either. We spend lots of time training and teaching our youth and our adult members more about our faith and about Jesus, but we are not simply a Bible school or seminary. And yes, we worship God through Jesus our Lord, but again, there is more to it than only worship.

We are St. Andrew's Episcopal Church, followers and disciples of Jesus Christ, and as such we are part of the body of Jesus Christ. Jesus lived in ancient Israel some 2,000 years

ago; we are trying to model our lives after his life. During his life, Jesus spent time simply hanging out with his disciples talking and laughing with them, encouraging and comforting them and so we make time to spend together to do these things. Jesus spent time helping people who needed help. And also here we have any number of ministries geared to helping others in our community. Jesus continuously taught his followers about who God is, what God wanted them to know, and how to live. Again, we also teach what Jesus taught and what the disciples taught so we can learn who God is and what He expects from us. Because of all this, we worship God because of who He is and for the love and care he shows us.
