# From the Rector

Dear Friends,

According to our church calendar, November is the last month of the year. The first Sunday of Advent occurs on November 27th and on that day we begin a new church vear. It is very appropriate that November is a month known for giving thanks. We start this thankfulness on November 2nd when we observe the Commemoration of Departed; this is also known as All Souls' All Faithful Day. It is on this day we make a point of remembering those who have passed to the nearer presence of the Lord. This service will be held at 10 am in the church. And although we simply say their names in the service, it is a time for us to remember and be thankful for their lives and for the blessing it has been to know them. Typically we remember things about the lives of our loved ones when we have the funeral services, but it is over the days, weeks, months and even the years that pass that things come to mind about those dearly departed. Those memories may make us smile, even laugh, or they may tug at our hearts. On All Souls' Day we gather those memories up again and thank God for letting us have the time with our departed loved ones that we did.

And then there is the grand Thanksgiving Day itself. I suspect that for many of us, Thanksgiving Day is a holiday of some stress. A big meal is usually prepared. For some of us company may be coming or at least family is there. For others perhaps there is no one at home anymore in which case a different type of stress is possible. In either situation though, Thanksgiving Day should be understood as a gift for us. It is a day that we have been given to be thankful to God for his blessings to us. Do you know that in the Bible one of the main faults God found with his people the Israelites was that they were not thankful? We are told over and over again to be thankful both in the Old Testament and in the New Testament. Is this command given to us because somehow God needs our thanks?

No, God wants us to have thankful hearts because being thankful is the primary source of joy and contentment. If you and I want to have joy and contentment, then we need to learn to be thankful. Thankfulness is not an automatic response for most of us. We need to make a conscious effort to notice things around us and consciously be appreciative to others and to God. We need to make the effort to verbally say "Thank you" to those around us and to God.

This month, the Commemoration of All Faithful Departed service is on Wednesday, November 2nd at 10 am in the church. If you have the name of a loved one you want read aloud, please make certain that you write the name on the list in the Narthex or that you call Jackie, the church secretary, at 352-683-2010. We will also have a Rite I Eucharist on Thanksgiving Day at 10 am. If you are able to come a bit early you will have the perfect place and opportunity to quietly give thanks to God for his blessings to you this past year.

God is so good to us; he is good to us because he loves us. In Ephesians Chapter 3 we are taught to pray for the strength to be able to comprehend the love of Christ which surpasses knowledge. My prayer for all of us this November is that we will learn to be more and more thankful to our loving Heavenly Father.

# The 48th Annual Diocesan Convention

The 48th Annual Convention of The Episcopal Diocese of Southwest Florida, attended by Fr. Lance & Diane Wallace, Craig & Glee Gates and Hal & Debbie Smith, provided continuing education, a celebration of ministries, the business of the diocese and worship that assembled hundreds of Episcopalians together as one.

The ministry fair consisted of many displays, demonstrations and handmade items to give away and to sell to help raise awareness and funds for a variety of Episcopal ministries.

Both mornings began with Morning Prayer service which was well attended and provided a glorious beginning to our days. Friday evening, Holy Eucharist was celebrated with pageantry and beauty. The workshops offered a variety of topics to refresh our understanding, renew skills, and widen our perspectives on new and worthwhile endeavors while maintaining the overall theme of the convention which was "Transformation through Reconciliation." When Bishop Smith

opened the Convention he did so with two questions: "Is your church a loving church and does your church serve the people and the community?" In his remarks he gave us three principles to guide us. Love one another; talk to one another; and most importantly, listen to one another. The plenary session, hosted by guest speaker and panel discussion leader, Rev. Jabriel S. Ballentine, was on the sin of racism as we experience it in our lives, our communities and our churches. The delegates also attended workshops on the following: youth ministries, the importance of healing in the churches, the diocese's ministries in the Dominican Republic, endowment programs, and grief support programs.

The Saturday morning business session consisted of introductions of visiting dignitaries and new clergy, various appointments, necrology, and voting for various diocesan positions. Our own Hal Smith was elected to the Diocesan Council. After noonday prayer, business continued with presentation of the treasurer and budget, report of vote, other business and closing prayers and adjournment. The only resolution on the docket was removed by the committee that had advanced it so there were no resolutions that were voted upon.

Once again it was a good time of fellowship and renewal. We were encouraged to continue the good work God has us doing here in Spring Hill.
