From the Rector

Dear Friends,

It has been a great November! Actually, it has been a great year! God has been so good to us here at St. Andrew's, hasn't He? That isn't to say that this year has not had its share of grief as well, yet God has been with us and continues to strengthen and guide us.

Last year at this time we were hoping to get started on the narthex project. And now, look! We have a beautiful addition to our church. It is used weekly for meetings and Bible studies and classes. I have heard only good things about the décor in the bathrooms and narthex hallway!

We are continuing to make improvements in our church. The pew seats will be replaced sometime in January (probably) but maybe not until February. The pews themselves are beautiful oak, but the seats are particle board covered with foam and fabric. The particle board is now over 40 years old and some of our pews seats are cracking. We have placed braces under the seats but those braces are simply temporary fixes until the seats themselves can be replaced with new plywood, foam and fabric. The plan was to carpet the entire church when we had the pews unfastened. However, I was told at this year's diocesan convention that carpeting a church was a bad idea because it muffles the sound too much! Since we are a liturgical church, our worship service is one that depends upon the congregation's responses and if the responses are muffled then it discourages worship. Well, we can't have that! The vestry decided to con-

tinue the flooring that is currently in the narthex into the church. It is more expensive than the carpet. At this point there have been three people who have volunteered to contribute towards the extra expense of the flooring. If you would like to contribute to this as well, that would be great.

We are now in the season of Advent. This is a penitential season so our church colors are blue. On November 27th and December 4th we are looking forward to the return of our Lord Jesus. Since his return will signal the end of the world, we want to be ready for his return and are reviewing our lives to make sure we are. We are also hoping and praying that God will stir the hearts of those in the world around us to turn to him before it is too late. On December 11th we have Rose Sunday when we begin to look forward to the celebration of our Lord's first coming to his people. Our attitudes change from introspection and penitence to joy and celebration. This is the emotion with which we enter the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services. Christ has come and Christ will return! This is the joy and expectation of all of us who are followers of our Lord Jesus!

May each of us have a meaningful and blessed Advent season!


