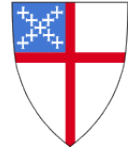

### From the Rector

Once again we hail a new year! Once more we have wonderful new things on the horizon for St. Andrew's! At the end of this month, Lord willing, we will have new flooring installed in our church. It will be a continuation of the flooring in our new narthex. If you would like to contribute to the cost of the new flooring, it would really be appreciated! Directly after the flooring is completed we will have the pew seats replaced. It is pretty exciting.

The narthex addition was completed this past year even though there were several unexpected bumps to get that accomplished. Everyone has appreciated the new restrooms. Our chapel is used weekly and so is our toddler room. The baby nursery is not yet used weekly but it is used at least once or twice a month.

This past year we have seen our church grow and we are looking forward to seeing it continue to grow. We are growing in attendance and in our financial giving. Two years ago we gave \$10,000 to Mission and Outreach. Last year we gave \$12,000 to Mission and Outreach. We gave money to People Helping People, K-9 for Patriots, our Spanish ministry, and to the Daughters of the King for local ministry support. We gave money to R.O.P.E. Center for regional ministry support and then the Heifer International for international ministry support. And since we are ending this year again with a surplus, this

coming year I plan to ask the Vestry to give \$15,000 for Mission and Outreach. I hope you find it as exciting as I do that God is prospering St. Andrew's so that we are able to not only support our own ministries but are able to help other ministries in our community and around the world!

This past year we also welcomed a new church administrator in the person of Debbie Smith! She has been a wonderful addition to the staff!

The New Year always starts with such promise. We have no idea what will really happen. We have hopes, expectations, and perhaps fears. Yet what will be has yet to be discovered and experienced. Scripture tells us that God's mercies are new every morning! We are told that God can be counted on because He is faithful.

I hope that as you look forward to this coming year that you desire to experience God's presence more in your life and desire to serve God even more effectively. Also, please pray for St. Andrew's that we continue to honor our Lord Jesus and that we will keep on growing. And as we keep on growing we can continue to help our church community, our Spring Hill community, and even those throughout the world.

## United Thank Offering

2016 was a busy year for the United Thank Offering. Your prayers of thanksgiving totaled a gift of \$1,493.38 from the spring and fall gatherings. Thank you to everyone who participates in this daily ministry. Your prayers and donations are God's hands in our nation and the world.

Because the people of Haiti once again fell victim to a terrible natural disaster, I wanted to tell you about two grants that will help them to rebuild. The Diocese of Colorado with the Companion Diocese of Haiti is using a \$64,000.00 grant to reforest degraded land with high-nutrition native fruit and nut trees using environmentally sustainable methods; to strengthen family garden and small animal husbandry programs at St. Paul's School; to train local producers in eco-friendly practices; to conscientiously integrate female students and teachers; and to empower girls with nutrition and agricultural skills.

Diocese of Haiti also applied for a \$41,300.00 grant to restore dormant farmland surrounding the diocesan-owned St. Barnabas' Agricultural College. A tractor and plow will be purchased. The food economy will be revitalized by making the land once again bear fruit and support the health and well-being of those who inhabit it.

Here in the United State the Diocese of New York will use a \$14,750.00 grant to build a greenhouse to develop local, healthy, and sustainable food production and consumption practices. The church is in a small village in a rural area. The site for the greenhouse is within a hundred yards of both a high school and affordable senior housing. Through existing membership and ministries of Grace Church, owners, farmers, and farm workers, as well as restaurant and food production workers, are able to connect to one another.

### **Question 1: Why do you want to serve as a Vestry member of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church?**
