From the Rector

Dear Friends,

This year March begins with Ash Wednesday and so it is appropriate that we once again consider what and why we observe this really rather odd ritual. Ash Wednesday is one of those peculiar Christian Holy Days that doesn't really make a lot of sense to those people outside the Christian faith and it even causes some Christians to wonder why we are doing it.

"Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." After all, having someone smear some ashes on your forehead and then telling you that you had a rather humble beginning and you will also end rather humbly is while on the one hand, realistic, it is also a bit, well, depressing, isn't it?

We know for a fact that people do indeed return to dust when they die but why do we have this service Ash Wednesday to remind us that we are going to die? On the one hand it is not supposed to be morbid; it is certainly supposed to be sobering. It is intended to remind us to look at our lives, our times, here on this earth and see them as God sees them and this service attempts to help us in this regard. We are here only a short time whether our lifetimes are measured in a few years or for 100. In the context of the span of eternity our lifetimes are a mere blink of the eye. And yet, even though our mortal life may be brief, God has given us life. He has brought us into the world and we have been given the opportunity to live! We can actually get to know God, to love him and others. We have been given the privilege to experience life with our senses and emotions and our minds. What a wonderful privilege life is!

Unfortunately, as humans we usually choose to live life in a 'me-centered' way. And living in this sort of manner, instead of making life better or fuller, makes our lives more miserable. So interestingly the service that is so serious and considered morbid by some is intended to help us to turn away from our tendencies to be self-centered and choose to put ourselves second by either self-disciplines of denying ourselves in some way or by adding some new behavior that will help us to look beyond ourselves. The idea is that we leave this service with a renewed desire to live our lives as God who gave us life intended, and that is with a greater desire to love Him and others.

As usual we will have two Ash Wednesday services, one at 10 am and one at 6 pm for those who work. We will not have our Adult Bible Study classes on this day. Our youth will once again be serving us pancakes on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday which this year will be Tuesday, February 28th. Tickets are available at each service, in the office or at the door.

I hope you will join us this year in observing Ash Wednesday and I hope you will continue to grow closer to our Lord and learn to live life more fully by following Jesus more closely.

Pastoral Care Ministry

The Pastoral Care Team brings the presence of Christ to the homebound, hospitalized and those who are in Rehab and extended care facilities. Holy Communion and Anointing for Healing are offered. If you do not feel called to administer Holy Communion and/or Anointing a caring visit and prayer are considered an important part of this ministry. This month Deacon Elaine shares with us her spiritual journey ministering to God’s people:

“After my ordination in 1993 in Providence, R.I, I began a prison ministry working with women in Maximum Security several times a week while working full time in a Domestic Violence Shelter. Once a month I would provide a Holy Eucharist service for men in Medium Security.

Upon moving to Florida in 2001, I contacted the women's facility in Spring Hill, but was told there was an extensive waiting list at the time. Working for the Department of Children & Families, brought me to the awareness of the dire need for good foster homes in Hernando County. We soon became licensed foster parents and have been ministering to children since 2004.

In 2013 after retiring the year before, I was asked to join the Pastoral Care team. Ministering to folks in hospitals, nursing homes

and rehabs had not been something I had considered but thought, "why not," I'll pray about it and give it some time in this ministry. Our God is an "awesome God." The Lord put me right where he wanted me to be. It truly has become a spiritual journey for me. There are times we simply visit parishioners once ----- and other occasions when we are there when the Lord is ready to take one home. Being called to the ministry of Pastoral Care may be something you too have been praying about. “ Deacon Elaine.
