From the Rector

Dear Friends,

November has been a great month! We had a wonderful Canterbury Festival, thank you Deb Smith for once again organizing and overseeing such a marvelous event. There were many, many volunteers from church, from each of our congregations who were here and helped. It was wonderful to see all of you together. And it appears that Canterbury Festival brought in around \$4000 for us to use for more outreach! We had our Veterans' Day celebration with music and special bookletsthank you to Jody and Lisa. We had a great Thanksgiving Day service on Thanksgiving. Then Bishop Dabney Smith was here on the 26th to baptize, receive, and confirm more people into our church! It was great month indeed! And as of the first Sunday of December we are now in the new Christian year! We are in the season of looking forward to the coming of Jesus and this season is called, appropriately enough, Advent which means 'arrival.' This is has a double meaning, doesn't it? The second Sunday we hear the readings about the ministry of John the Baptist when begins his preaching ministry with "Prepare ye the way of the Lord." The third Sunday, also called Rose Sunday, we hear again about John but there is a turn-now there is the excitement in the air that the King is almost here—now the penance is turning to joy and eager anticipation. And then on the fourth Sunday we have story of Gabriel and Mary. So we see the change in tone as it were from the darkness before the dawn in the first two Sundays to the sky slowly lighting to the brilliance of the sun breaking over the horizon. What a joy for us to experience this again in our new Christian year. I look forward to experiencing this new season and this New Year with all of you! Warmly in Christ,

THE STAR OF BETHLEHEM



After His birth, astrologers from the east arrived in Jerusalem, asking. "Where is the new born King of the Jews? We have observed the rising of his star, and we have come to pay him homage." (Matt. 2:1-2) During this time of the year when we are getting ready for Christmas, we see all sorts of images of the Star of Bethlehem. It appears on Christmas cards with images of the 3 kings following it. There are Christmas advertisements showing the star above the Holy Family. There are hymns about the star and stories about the three kings following it. Was there a star of something else to announce the Birth of Jesus? Some modern scholars call the story of the Star of Bethlehem "pious fiction". Stating that the historic event described in the Gospel of Matthew is not described in any of the other Gospels and it may have been created to enforce the divinity of Christ. Furthermore, this "star" has never appeared in the heavens again.

In 1603, Prof. Dan Hughes put forth a theory about the Star of Bethlehem. He claimed that through his research it was a conjunction between Jupiter and Saturn as Saturn was in the constellation of Pisces. His theory was based upon the following: Saturn was the planet of "Old Rulers". Jupiter is the Royal planet of the King planet and the constellation of Pisces was the sign of Kings to the ancient Israelis. The conjunction took place about the time of Christ's birth. Hughes theory was that this conjunction would have appeared in May while looking East from Asia, between Sept. and Oct. looking West it would appear over the Jerusalem/Bethlehem region and it would appear directly over Bethlehem looking South from Jerusalem in December. Frederick Larson's theory was that the Star of Bethlehem was the conjunction of Jupiter, Regulus and Venus. Larson's theory was that the star first appeared about in June. The conjunction between Jupiter (the Royal star-in Hebrew it meant "Righteous") and Venus (star for Love and Fertility). This would have been about the time that the Archangel Gabriel visited Mary to tell her that she will become pregnant by the Holy Spirit.

The second conjunction was between Jupiter and Regulus (the brightest star in the constellation Leo) and would have appeared from late November through December. This star would have been the brightest star in the heavens and it would appear to be located directly over Bethlehem. Whether any of the theories of men trying to explain God's miracles make sense or not, isn't it awesome to have the event placed in scriptures for us to know that God loves each of us enough to light up the heavens with a star to announce the birth of His beloved son and to use that star to lead us to Jesus-even today.

We can get very busy and forget the everyday blessings of God in our lives: an incredible sunrise, an unexpected call from a dear friend, making all the green lights on highway 19, the list of little things goes on and on. The UTO Blue Box is a simple vehicle to help us remember God cares so much for us in these busy lives we live. From the smallest smile to the biggest answer to prayer, He is always with us. Dropping a dime or quarter in the Blue Box allows us to stop and reflect on His presence all around us.

Just as Jesus multiplied the loaves and fishes, the UTO offerings are distributed throughout our nation and the global Episcopal/Anglican church network. Grants are given to build schools, health clinics, youth centers, community gardens, purchase transport vehicles and to provide handicapped compliance, music ministries and so much more. All from our pocket change.


This year St. Andrew's collected \$696.38 from our spring ingathering, and \$541.05 from our fall ingathering, for a total of \$1,238.03 which has been sent to the United Thank Offering to be combined with funds from all over the world for the 2018 grants. Thank you.

I have chaired this ministry for six years. As I prepare to move to New Mexico I am praying that God will touch your heart to oversee this program going forward. All funds collected by UTO are given in grants. Basically you need to select the two dates each year for the UTO weekend.

Once you and Father Lance have set the dates you will need to1.) put a reminder in the bulletin for the ingathering weekend, 2.) set up a table in the narthex the week before the ingathering to display the blue boxes and the offering envelopes (and of course return the unused materials to storage after the offering) and 3.) follow up with the Treasurer to publish the total collected. If you wish to speak on UTO during the worship service you may, but if you are not comfortable speaking we have a wonderful flash drive full of presentations that can be played on the screens during the announcements. I encourage you to consider making UTO your ministry in 2018. Blessing guaranteed!


