# From the Rector

Dear Friends,

Calendars are a fascinating study. We are beginning a new calendar year this month—Happy 2018! We began a new church year at the beginning of December and we are now half-way through our program year. At the end of this month we have our annual meeting and then our church budget year begins. Calendars are ways we use to mark off the time in our lives. We see in the Scriptures that calendars are gifts from God. He gave us ways to mark time through the seasons, through the movements of the moon and through the changing of the stars in the night sky. It is important to make marks in time for us so that we make time for celebrations, we set a time to reach a goal, and we make time to remember God. If we did not have calendars, all days would be the same and that is not what God wants for us. That's why he had the ancient Hebrews have one day a week as a holy day. Every week they were to set that one day aside; they were to treat it differently than all the other days of the week. On that day they were to spend time with God; they were to spend time relaxing; they were to spend time with each other. Then throughout the year God had his people set other days aside for special purposes. We do the same thing still, don't we? It is important for us to set time aside to worship God, and to celebrate as we achieve our goals.

Speaking of making time for celebrations, every year on the first Sunday after Epiphany we celebrate our church's birthday. Now Betty Audette has told me that actually our official birthday is not the first Sunday after Epiphany, it is on June 29th. We were officially formed by Bishop Hargrave on that day in 1971. Yet, we celebrate in January because everyone is here in January. If we were to wait until June 29th not only would all our snow birds have flown away, but many of our year-rounders are on vacation and out of the area. This year for our birthday we have much to celebrate! This year, God has blessed us through a gift from

Shirley Smith to pay off the rest of our mortgage! Therefore we will have a mortgage burning celebration on January 7<sup>th</sup> along with our honoring of our volunteers, our Volunteer of the Year, and clergy anniversaries. To help us celebrate, Canon Anne Vickers, the diocesan CFO will be here to officially burn the mortgage! I hope you will plan to join us!

Another purpose of calendars is to help us make goals. Our Vestry makes goals every year at the annual vestry retreat. Our retreat takes place the first weekend of February and we spend time Friday evening and Saturday together talking and making goals for the year. Over the years we have planned for physical needs of our church, the projectors and screens, the narthex, the pews, and most recently the sacristy. We plan for spiritual needs as well by considering what we can do as a church to encourage people to come to know the Lord Jesus and learn to follow him better.

Time is a gift from God and so is the marking of time. This coming 2018 I encourage you to make certain that on your personal calendar you set time every week to worship God, you set time to celebrate your achievements, and that you make time to set spiritual and physical goals for yourself!

## The Deacon's Bench

Deacon Ludwig Wallner THREE WISE MEN - MAGI



On January 6, we celebrate Epiphany. The word Epiphany means "revealing" or "showing forth". Most of us think of Epiphany as the time the wise men arrived and worshipped Jesus as the "King of the Jews". We can also consider Epiphany as the time when Jesus' future ministry of salvation will be revealed to the Gentiles.

Who are the wise men? The only thing we know from scripture is what is written in Matthew 2:1-12. The wise men from the East followed a star to find the new born "King of the Jews".

We do not know how many wise men sought Jesus, we assume three because of the three gifts presented. The gifts were gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold is associated with royalty and kings - Jesus was the "King of the Jews". Frankincense was used in the worship of God in the temples and signified the worship of Jesus. Myrrh is a perfume which is placed on the dead to cover the odor of death - this signified that Jesus would suffer and die.

The magi came from the East according to Matthew's Gospel which may have been from the area now occupied by Iraq, Iran, or Saudi Arabia.

The word "magi" comes from the Greek word "magus". The word "magus" comes from the ancient Persian word "maugatai". This term was only given to priests in the religious sect in ancient Persia known as Zoroastrianism. They were well educated and highly respected and held in high esteem in their society. Today they would be known as astrologers and astronomers.

A popular legend and tradition is that the magi had names which we know:

**Gaspar:** has brown hair and beard, wears a green and gold robe and his crown is encrusted with jewels. He may have been the King of Sheba and is associated with frankincense.

**Melchior:** has a long white beard and hair, wears a gold robe and his crown is plain. He may have been the King of Arabia and is associated with the gift of gold.

**Balthazar:** is thought to have dark skin and a black beard and hair, wears a purple robe. He may have been the King of Tarsi and Egypt and is associated with the gift of myrrh.

She was born in Guyana and is a life long Anglican and now Episcopalian. At her church in Guyana she served in many ministries in a leadership position. She taught in an Anglican School for many years.




